Hafa Adai! Senator Barnett:

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 247-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 247-37 (COR) is an act to amend §6A118 of Chapter 6A, Title 18, Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations Relative to the approval of leases of the Chamorro Land Trust.

The proposed legislation intends to add language which allows the Commission to award leases to qualified applicants regardless of date and time of the application. In addition, Bill No. 247-37 provides that in order to determine prior and continuous usage, an applicant must submit a government issued document indicating the start date of continuous usage including but not limited to a Land Use Permit (LUP) or mayor's certification. Further, the proposed legislation outlines stipulations in which the Commission may ratify previously awarded leases regardless of date and time of the application.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
