The Bureau requests that Bill No. 272-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill 272-37 (COR) is an Act to amend §5252 of Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to modernizing the retention and dissemination of the procurement record and promoting transparency and efficiency in government.

Although the legislation does make reference to establishing fees for PDF records, it does indicate that PDF records that are available online or through electronic transfer, such as electronic mail (email), shall not be assessed fees.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
