The Bureau requests that Bill No. 307-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229, as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 307-37 (COR) is an act to *add* a new Chapter 9.7 to Division 1 Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated relative to the Paralegal Profession.

Based on comments received regarding Bill No. 307-37 (COR), the Judiciary of Guam (JOG) believes that absent further information in the bill, the approximate fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time.
