The Bureau requests that Bill No. 379-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill 379-37 (COR) is an Act to authorize the Chamorro Land Trust Commission (CLTC) and the Department of Land Management to realign the Bull Cart Trail from the north portion of Lot 2019-REM through the north portion of Lot 2121-2-R/1 and to allow the owners to consolidate their lots for seamless development.

The proposed legislation states that the CLTC, through Resolution 2023-01, acknowledged its support of the relocation of the bull cart as delineated on Map No. 069FY2019, and that the decision to support the relocation was based on the Guam Land Use Commission's (GLUC) approval of the request from the owners of the lots abutting the bull cart trail. It appears the intent of the proposed legislation is to codify the approvals by both the CLTC and GLUC noted above.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
