**BUREAU OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT RESEARCH
COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 150-37 (COR)**

The proposed legislation intends to amend §6225(c)(1) of Chapter 6, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated by including those employed and specifically identified by the Mayor's Council of Guam (MCOG) as hazardous duty personnel. Per the legislation, such employees shall be entitled to a hazardous pay differential of 10% upon exposure to dangerous conditions in preparation and following typhoons, as well as, during periods of emergencies.

The Bureau reached out to the MCOG for comments and/or testimony on the fiscal impact, but has not received a response to date. The Bureau estimates that the following positions may be affected by the proposed legislation: Mayors, Vice Mayors, Community Maintenance Workers, Municipal Clerks, Recreation Leader Is, Recreation Leader IIs, and Recreation Supervisors.

However, absent information from the MCOG regarding specific hazardous duty personnel, as well as being unable to predict the frequency of typhoons or any declaration of emergency, the Bureau is unable to provide an approximate financial impact at this time.
