1/ Bill No. 226-37 (COR) is an act to amend § 21103 of Chapter 21, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated relative to requiring sanitary permits to be renewed every year on the anniversary date of issue. Currently, the sanitary permits are to be renewed every 30th of June, regardless of when such sanitary permits were issued.

Although primarily administrative in nature, the proposed language appears to omit the last sentence of the current statute, which reads: "The fee for the permit shall be determined by the Director by regulation and shall be collected by him." The Bureau notes that the FY 2022 audited revenues collected under the DPHSS Sanitary Inspection Revolving Fund is reported at \$304,129, while the unaudited revenues for FY 2023 is reported at \$428,743. The DPHSS Sanitary Inspection Revolving Fund is used by the Division of Environmental Health for its operations.
