Bureau of Budget and Management Research Comments on Bill No. 250-37 (LS)

The proposed legislation intends to establish and codify a multi-agency unified law enforcement group known "MAULEG" for the purposes of suppressing the importation, distribution, and selling of narcotics and illicit drugs on Guam.

Per comments provided by the Guam Police Department, the unbudgeted costs necessary to support the MAULEG program is estimated at approximately \$530,662 per annum. This will consist of administrative personnel costs (\$120,454) for the recruitment of two (2) administrative assistants; administrative staff overtime costs (\$8,588) for preparation and attending meetings held after regular working hours; stipends (\$120,000) for the deputization of twenty (20) civilians; and training supplies (e.g. printed training materials, office supplies, and fuel) and equipment (e.g., computers, software, official vehicles, etc.) costs (\$281,620). Further, it is assumed that the Office of Technology will be the government entity to establish and administer the program's website as stipulated in the proposed legislation to post public notices, information, and other criteria for public search and awareness as the GPD lack the sufficient manpower to assume this role.
