COMMENTS ON BILL NO. 275-37 (COR)

The proposed legislation intends to place the Airport Police and Aircraft Rescue Fire Fighting (ARFF) positions on the Guam International Airport Authority's (GIAA) Certified, Technical, and Professional (CTP) pay scales to eliminate the bifurcation of Airport Police and ARFF positions, and the GIAA's CTP positions. Although the GIAA Board has the authority to adjust compensation for the CTP positions, Airport Police and ARFF, the Government of Guam's Law Enforcement Officer (LEO) Pay Plan restricts the GIAA from migrating the Airport Police and ARFF to the GIAA's CTP pay plan. Presently, the Airport Police and ARFF fall under the Government of Guam's LEO pay plan, which has caused inconsistencies in the application of the personnel rules and pay adjustments as the application of the rules and regulations is done on an *ad hoc* basis and shifts between the GIAA CTP rules and the Government of Guam's LEO pay plan.

Upon passage of the proposed Bill, the GIAA CTP rules shall apply to the selection, compensation, promotion, performance evaluation, disciplinary action, and other terms and conditions of employment of Airport Police and ARFF positions. Further, within ninety (90) days of enactment, the GIAA Board shall slot the Airport Police and ARFF positions on to the GIAA's CTP position pay scale.

According to the GIAA, the financial impact of the proposed legislation is estimated to be \$4,500 to \$4,700 per pay period. The estimated financial impact was accounted for in the GIAA FY 2024 Operating Budget and poses no impact to the General Fund.
