The Bureau requests that Bill No. 28-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Legislative Bill No. 28-37 (COR) is an act to add a new Article 4 to Chapter 18, Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to adopting a standardized type-face for the Government of Guam for use on all official documents, reports, and communications generated after the Bill's enactment.

The Bill appears to be administrative in nature. However, it may result in increased personnel and supply costs as government entities will have to re-generate documents, standard forms, etc. if necessary to comply with the proposed mandate.
