The Bureau requests that Bill No. 35-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229, as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill No. 35-37 (COR) is an act to amend § 51111 (a)(9) of Article 1, Chapter 51, Division 2, Title 10, Guam Code annotated, relative to updating the prohibition of open detonation and clarifying the implementation of safe alternatives for the protection of Guam's air, water, land, and the health of its people. The amendment will require a protective permit and shall be reported to the Guam EPA within thirty (30) calendar days of each open detonation.

The bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any of the funds of Government of Guam.
