 1/ The proposed legislation intends to add a new §40145 to Article 1 Chapter 40, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, which requires the Mayor's Council of Guam (MCOG) to procure and avail Automated External Defibrillators (AED) in all senior centers and recreational facilities under the purview of each village mayor. The bill indicates that the AEDs be made available during the hours that these facilities are open to the public. The MCOG has the authority to create provisions for the deployment and use of these AEDs, inclusive of training and maintenance for each machine. This bill requires that the access to these AEDs must be completed no later than June 30, 2024. Lastly, in order to fund the procurement of the defibrillators, the MCOG would need to request an additional appropriation from *I Liheslaturan Guahan* on an annual basis (incorporated into their Fiscal Year Budget request).

 Should this legislation be enacted into law, the MCOG would need to submit a request for appropriation to *I Liheslaturan Guahan* no later than June 30, 2023 for the first procurement of the AEDs. There is no information provided that is relative to the price of each AED or the quantity needed for all senior centers and recreational facilities throughout the island. Absent pertinent information from the MCOG, the Bureau is unable to determine the full fiscal impact of this legislation.
