The Bureau requests that Bill No. 66-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Bill 66-37 (COR) is an Act to repeal Article 14, Chapter 5, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated relative to removing the Guam Procurement Advisory Council.

Although the legislation doesn't reflect a section for legislative findings and intent, local media outlets have reported that this measure, along with other similar measures, intends to eliminate Government of Guam boards that have been inactive.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
