Hafa Adai! Senator Barnett:

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 67-37 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229 as amended for the following reason(s):

Legislative Bill No. 67-37 (COR) is an act to repeal Chapter 22 of Title 1 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to removing the Guam War Reparation Commission. Per comments from the Office of *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, the submitted 2018 Transition Advisory Commission Report recommended to abolish several Boards and Commissions, including the Guam War Reparation Commission, and referenced Section 2 of Public Law 26-119 which states, “[a]ny board, commission, council or oversight body that has not met in the last twelve (12) months, with the exception of bodies relating to the Department of Education, the Guam Community College, the University of Guam, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, and the Guam Election Commission, shall hereby be abolished.”

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
