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**Footnotes:**

1/: In its current form, the subject legislation proposes to expand access to opioid antagonists by establishing an emergency opioid access bystander program and allowing insurance companies to cover associated costs. The Bill requires the GBHWC to establish the aforementioned emergency opioid access bystander program which shall involve establishing one or more publicly accessible emergency opioid antagonist locations within the island and determine the potential location or locations of such antagonists as well as monitoring the use of such antagonist locations. The legislation also requires the GBHWC to create and distribute opioid overdose response toolkits including distribution to participating private businesses and to research and apply for additional funding through the federal government and/or private entities. Based on the foregoing, there will likely be a cost impact to the GBHWC (personnel, building rental, supplies, etc.). However, the overall impact cannot be determined at this time absent additional information from the Center. Lastly, it should be noted that the Bill proposes to add new subsections to Title 10 GCA, Chapter 16, Division 1 which was repealed by P.L. 22-130:1 and reenacted as Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 10 GCA.
