



ASSISTANT CHIEF DAREN DEE BURRIER

Guam Fire Department Special Operations Bureau

Assistant Fire Chief Daren Burrier has built a distinguished career as a firefighter that spans four decades. Thirty-six years with the Guam Fire Department and four years in the United States Air Force. He started as a Fire Service Specialist as an Honor Graduate of the Air Force Fire Academy in 1985 where he was trained in structural and airport crash firefighting. He was assigned to Anderson Air Force Base for the next four years. During his four-year tour in Guam, he decided to make Guam his home and applied for the Guam Fire Department at the end of his enlistment in 1989. He graduated the Guam Fire Academy with the 11th Fire Cycle and was assigned to Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and Rescue Operations, until his promotion to Fire Captain – when he was assigned as Officer in Charge, of the EMS division in 1997. In 2011, he became Acting EMS Operations Commander, until his promotion to Assistant Fire Chief in 2015. From then till present, he has been assigned command over various department bureaus, Operations Bureau, EMS/Rescue Bureau, Training Bureau and Special Operations Bureau. He has been tasked with overseeing quality assurance, training, writing operating procedures and regulations, ambulance billing and daily ambulance, rescue operations.

Chief Burrier has devoted his time toward training future generations of men and women aspiring to become fire fighters. He was instrumental in developing the fire recruit physical agility test (FRPAT) that provides entry level testing that better reflects firefighter duties. He led the process of converting all firefighters to National Registry Certifications by instructing the transition course to enable testing for that level. He also spearheaded the move to Paramedic training and certification through Department of Labor Grant and a collaborative effort with School of EMS, Guam Community College and Guam Fire Department. In addition to his full-time responsibilities with GFD, he has been an adjunct instructor at Guam Community College, and he has provided instructional support to other organizations throughout the region. At GCC he taught Emergency Medical Technician Courses for 20 years, he has taught ICS courses for the Pacific Region Disaster Preparedness center in Saipan and taught emergency medical responder to Pohnpei FSM firefighters. Serves as Chairperson on the Guam Trauma Regional Advisory Council, Vice Chairperson on the Emergency Medical Services Commission, Member of the GCC Nursing and Allied Health Advisory Board.

Chief Burrier earned an associate degree in Fire Science from GCC, currently in his junior year at Columbia Southern University studying Fire Management and part of the 2nd Paramedic Cohort.

He has a long list of certifications to name a few:

- a) Assigned as Bureau Chief of the newly formed Special Operations Bureau. The command has oversights of several special operational resources in the Guam Fire Department. Units assigned to Special Operations are Paramedic, Ambulance, Rescue, Hazardous Materials and Drone Operations.

1) Acting Fire Chief- as needed

- a) In times of the Fire Chief absence from the island I have acted as the Guam Fire Chief for a total of approximately 157+ days. During these times of acting, I have dealt with various issues such as reopening of closed fire stations, attending informational and oversight hearings, civil service commission hearings, high profile rescue missions, etc. During these times I was able to maintain a positive image for the department and maintain the direction for improvement.

2) Training Bureau Chief

- a) Assigned Training Bureau Chief, duties include supervision of Training Office Staff comprised of, Battalion Chief, Fire Captain, Firefighter I, II's, Lieutenants. Supervises training programs and activities of the fire Department in fire suppression, prevention, rescue, and ambulance operations; prescribes training methods and procedures to be followed by firefighters; evaluates training conditions and syllabuses for effectiveness and prescribes measures to improve learning objectives. Establish and maintain department wide training records, development and administer of a department wide training program involving specific training in Pro-Board Fire, EMS, Fire Academy, and pertinent continued education requirements to ensure all personnel remain proficient in emergency response capabilities. Work with Guam Community College in developing a Memorandum of Agreement for the Operation Fire Academy. Prepares training reports and participates in the budget for training equipment.
- b) Oversaw the 21st Fire Academy of 45 recruits ensuring the scheduling of courses and activities met mandates of required training and completion of

National Certification (NREMT) in EMS, of which approximately 80% are NREMT certified and the remaining 20% are awaiting testing. Established Training records for EMS training for all fire department personnel.

- d) Oversaw the establishment of the Ambulance Billing system that has generated over 2 million dollars in collections since the beginning of billing in October 2012; worked with the billing company to establish Medicare and Medicaid numbers for the Fire Department allowing for the ability to bill and collect revenue from Medicaid and Medicare patients. Added revenue to the FLAME Fund has allowed for the purchase of needed EMS equipment and funding for personnel training and equipment that will ensure training that will meet the highest national standard. Ensures the timely submission of patient care reports, review PCRs for quality assurance and conduct counseling as needed for improvement in documentation. Prepares data reports detailing number of EMS transports, type of emergencies, transports, revenue collection, etc. Develop and establish standard operating procedures for GFD EMS Operations. Meets with medical facilities, local businesses, Government Agencies, e.g., GIAA, DOE, GHS, etc., to establish Memorandums of Agreement detailing EMS operational procedures when interacting with party involved in agreement.

7) **Company Commander**

Maintains and operates a variety of structural firefighting equipment, e.g., mechanical blower, power generator, axes, shovels, hoses, adapters, and other paraphernalia.
- b) **Crash.** Responds to actual or potential air-crash emergencies to prevent or extinguish fires and rescue plane crew and passengers. Performs duties of Crew Chief directing up to three personnel in air-crash firefighting tactics. Performs duties of operator, drives to scene of crash or to end of runway where distressed craft is expected to land. Sets up vehicle according to emergency and, as required, sprays water foam mixture, chemicals, or other extinguishing agent to minimize fire and explosion on impact. Participates in removal of trapped or injured crewmembers and passengers. Use power saws or pneumatic chisels and other power equipment, if necessary, to gain entry to damaged craft. Neutralizes aircraft egress systems such as ejection seat, cockpit hatch, and doors. Renders first aid to the injured. Establish fire lines to prevent unauthorized persons from entering crash area. Cools explosive ordinance material when fighter planes, bombers, or cargo aircraft are involved. Deactivates aircraft electrical power to prevent fires or explosions. Drives and operates a variety of crash firefighting vehicles, e.g., P-15 Crash Firefighting Truck, P-13 Crash Firefighting Truck, P-20 Crash Firefighting Truck, P-2 Crash

- g) October 1985 – Completed an 8-week Basic Fire Specialist Course (Academy) with U.S. Air Force Training Center, Chanute, Illinois. Received Honor Graduate Certificate. Specific lessons include structural and crash firefighting techniques, pump operations with the use of hydraulics, rescue techniques, and technical service training (prevention), e.g., fire code, fire inspection, blueprint reading, pre-fire planning, etc.
