Six days out from the most devastating typhoon our island has experienced in decades, our recovery efforts are yielding strong results. Power and water are in the process of being safely and methodically restored to our island, with more substations and wells coming online every day. Through the work of our mayors, our Department of Public Works, and the initiative of our people, debris has been cleared from the roads. The Guam National Guard and the Guam Police Department have joined forces to ensure our people are safe on our roads. AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE I MAGA'HÂGAN GUÂHAN TO UTILIZE UP TO FIFTY MILLION DOLLARS (\$50,000,000) FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR EMERGENCY RESPONSE EXPENSES IN RESPONSE TO TYPHOON MAWAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Emergency Expenses. Notwithstanding any other provision or
- 3 law, and in addition to the authority granted in Title 5 Guam Code Annotated §
- 4 22402 and in Public Law 36-107, I Maga'hågan Guåhan [the Governor] is
- 5 authorized to utilize up to Fifty Million Dollars (\$50,000,000) from the General

Fund for emergency response expenses in response to Typhoon Mawar, including but not limited to expenses related to safety and security; food, water, and sheltering; health and medical; energy; communications; transportation; and hazardous materials. Individual Assistance is specifically authorized for use of funds appropriated herein, and I Maga'håga shall coordinate with the Federal Emergency Management Authority and the American Red Cross to compile survey data for the individual assistance determinations. I Maga'håga shall further disburse One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) from the funds appropriated herein to each mayor, who may utilize such monies for the purposes identified above. Mayors shall report any expenditure of funds provided herein to I Maga'håga and I Liheslaturan Guåhan [the Legislature] within thirty (30) days after such transactions. I Maga'håga shall provide a written report of any expenditure of funds provided in this Act, other than the expenditures by the Mayors, to I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the Public Auditor within twenty (20) days after the end of the month beginning with May 2023. Appropriations made herein may be expended provided that it does not negatively impact the current operational needs of the Executive Branch.

Section 2. Reporting Requirement. The written report should contain sufficient detail of expenditures to qualify for federal reimbursement as allowed through the emergency declaration resulting from Typhoon Marwar. The Department of Administration shall work with the Office of the Public Auditor to ensure these emergency expenditures are reported properly and meet the requirements for reimbursement.

Section 3. Reimbursements. Such reimbursements by the federal government as a result of the expenditures allowed herein shall be immediately deposited into the General Fund upon receipt by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*, the Department of Administration or any other instrumentality of the government of Guam and shall not be subject to further transfer authority.

1 Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective immediately.
