AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §72101.1 TO CHAPTER 72 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT FIREFIGHTER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 3 finds that there is no statute that establishes the minimum qualifications for the position of Guam Fire Department ("GFD") Firefighter. Individuals 4 interested in becoming a Firefighter are currently evaluated based on 5 standards established by the Department of Administration, which include 6 information relative to the nature of work, illustrative examples of work, 7 minimum knowledge, abilities, and skills, minimum experience and training, 8 9 and special qualifications necessary for employment.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to establish minimum 10 qualifications in statute for the position of GFD Firefighter. I Liheslaturan 11 Guåhan intends to mirror standard requirements already established for 12 officers of the Guam Police Department. Applicants for the position of GPD 13 14 officer must meet these qualifications in addition to those promulgated by These standards will help to promote consistency among the DOA. 15 16 qualification requirements for entry-level positions among the government of Guam's primary law enforcement and public safety agencies. 17

Section 2. Minimum Qualifications. A new §72101.1 is hereby 1 added to Chapter 72 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated relative to the 2 3 minimum qualifications for Guam Fire Department Firefighter. "§72101.1. Minimum Qualifications for Guam Fire Department 4 Firefighter. 5 (a) Notwithstanding other provisions of law to the contrary, persons 6 appointed as Firefighters shall: 7 (1) be a resident of the Territory of Guam and a U.S. citizen; 8 (2) be of good health and good moral character; 9 (3) be over the age of eighteen (18) years; 10 (4) be a high school graduate or equivalent, but the POST 11 Commission may set higher academic qualifications for all 12 applicants as the Commission considers necessary; 13 (5) submit to and pass a drug screening test, including but not 14 limited to a urinalysis test; 15 16 (6) submit to psychological testing; and (7) submit to and pass a polygraph examination. 17 (b)No person shall be appointed a Firefighter who has not established 18 19 satisfactory evidence of qualifications by passing a physical examination, which shall include a physical agility test, and written 20 examinations based upon standards relevant to the duties to be 21 performed, which standards shall be established by the Fire Chief 22 in conjunction with the Department of Administration. 23 24 (c) No person shall be appointed a Firefighter who has been convicted in any civilian or military court of a felony, a crime involving 25 moral turpitude, a crime of domestic or family violence, or who 26 has been administratively pardoned of any crime. 27

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- (d)No person shall be appointed a Firefighter before a thorough
 investigation of the applicant's background and moral character is
 completed.
- 4 (e) A Firefighter dismissed for cause shall be permanently ineligible
 5 for reappointment to any position in the Department. A Firefighter
 6 who resigns for the sole purpose of negating or averting a pending
 7 or anticipated disciplinary action to dismiss the Firefighter shall be
 8 ineligible for reappointment.
- (f) No person shall be appointed a firefighter who has not established 9 satisfactory evidence, through written examination administered by 10 the Department of Administration ("DOA") or a competent 11 authority, of the ability to recognize and understand persons with 12 disabilities, including special needs and mental illness. DOA shall 13 include a minimum of two (2) items within the written examination 14 relative to persons with disabilities, including special needs and 15 16 mental illness. For the purpose of this section, the term disability(ies), as is defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act, 17 shall mean a physical or mental impairment that substantially 18 limits one (1) or more major life activities of an individual." 19
- Section 3. Effective Date. The provisions contained herein shall be effective within ninety (90) days following enactment. The Guam Fire Department, in coordination with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities, shall recommend examination items to DOA for consideration prior to the implementation of this Act.
- 26 Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application 27 to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such

- 1 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which
- 2 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this
- 3 end the provisions of this Act are severable.
