## *I MINA' TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN* 2011 (FIRST) Regular Session

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 3102.1 AND 3103 OF CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 1, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AND TO REPEAL SECTION 3103.1,OF CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 1, TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ALLOWING I MAGA'LAHEN GUAHAN, THE GOVERNOR OF GUAM, TO APPOINT THE SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION.

## **1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Section 1. Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that

- 3 Public Law No. 31- 21 made the Superintendent of Education a cabinet
- 4 member of I Maga' Lahen Guahan, the Governor of Guam. The Guam
- 5 Department of Education is the largest public agency and collaboration and
- 6 cooperation among the three government branches is necessary to ensure the
- 7 education department receives needed resources. *I Liheslatura* further finds
- 8 that the Governor, as Chief Executive Officer, has the right and
- 9 responsibility to ensure that every student is given necessary resources.
- 10 Therefore, *I Liheslatura*, intends to provide policy that returns the
- 11 appointing authority of the Superintendent of Education to I Maga' Lahi,
- 12 subject to the advice and consent of *I Liheslatura*.

13 Section 2. Section 3102.1 of Chapter 3, Article 1, Title 17, Guam

14 Code Annotated is amended to read:

## 1 "§ 3102.1. Duties of the Guam Education Board.

2 The Guam Education Board *shall* be responsible for all policies that govern

3 the Department of Education (hereinafter "Department"). The Board *shall* 

- 4 have the authority to delegate such of its powers as it may deem appropriate,
- 5 but *shall* retain the ultimate responsibility for the exercise of its powers.

6 The Board, among other duties, *shall* perform the following in accordance

7 with applicable law:

8 (a) -select and appoint a Superintendent and support him/her in the

9 discharge of his/her duties;

10 (a) (b) receive, evaluate and act upon the recommendations and reports of

- 11 the Superintendent;
- 12 (b) (c) adopt an annual budget and control expenditures accordingly; review

13 periodic financial reports and modify the budget if and when necessary;

14 (c) (d) adopt student performance standards and assessment models;

15 (d) (e) ensure that the Superintendent addresses the proper administration of

- 16 all mandated responsibilities;
- 17 (e) (f) adopt attendance areas and school boundaries;
- 18 (f) (g) sue and/or defend itself in suits at law;
- 19 (g) (h) report routine complaints and concerns related to the Department's

20 operations directly to the Superintendent for appropriate investigation and

21 response;

- 22 (h) (i) have *no* business or pecuniary interest which will conflict with the
- 23 activities of the Board;
- 24 (i) (j) establish student discipline policy;
- 25 (j) (k) establish a school calendar;
- 26 (k) (H) establish graduation standards;
- 27 (1) (m) periodically review established policies for refinement and

- 1 improvement;
- 2 (m) (n) serve as Guam's State Education Policy/Governing Board for
- 3 Federal programs where such a board is required by Federal law, to include,
- 4 but *not* be limited to, the Head Start Program;
- 5 (n)  $(\mathbf{o})$  act as the approving authority on behalf of the Department for
- 6 collective bargaining agreements;
- 7 (o) (p) make recommendations to I Maga'lahen Guåhan or I Liheslaturan
- 8 *Guåhan* for changes, additions or deletions to Guam Education Laws;
- 9 (p) (q) each newly elected or appointed Board member shall complete,
- 10 during the first year of that member's first term, a training program to be
- 11 prepared and offered by the University of Guam and the Department,
- 12 regarding the skills and knowledge necessary to serve as a local school
- 13 board member. The training program *shall* include:
- 14 (1) review of the Guam Code Annotated and other laws pertaining to DOE;
- 15 (2) Roberts Rules of Order;
- 16 (3) the budgeting procedures and guidelines of the government of Guam and17 the Department; and
- 18 (4) difference(s) between policy making and micromanagement of the
- 19 affairs of the Department; and
- 20 (r) the role of the Board, as with any legislative body, is to act collectively,
- 21 not individually. Any Board member shall report to I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 22 any potential or alleged violation of this Subsection. The Board *shall not*:
- 23 (1) interfere in or micro-manage the affairs of the Department, or schools
- 24 within the Department; or
- 25 (2) involve itself with student discipline cases, *unless* expressly authorized
- 26 by public law, and *only* to the extent authorized by public law."

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Section 3. Section 3103 of Chapter 3, Article 1, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

3 "§ 3103. Superintendent of Education.

4 I Maga'Lahen Guahan, the Governor of Guam, shall appoint T the

- 5 Superintendent of Education (the Superintendent), subject to the advice and
- 6 consent of I Liheslaturan Guahan, who shall be the Chief Executive Officer
- 7 of the internal operating organization of the Department of Education and
- 8 *shall* be responsible for the administration of the academic and services
- 9 activities thereof. The Superintendent *shall* be responsible for implementing
- 10 the policies adopted by the Board. The Board shall appoint the

11 Superintendent of Education by an affirmative vote of at least six (6)

- 12 members. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the employment of
- 13 the Superintendent shall be by contract term of four (4) years, which
- 14 contract shall contain a provision that the Superintendent's employment may
- 15 only be terminated for cause, as defined in this Chapter. In the case of the
- 16 temporary absence of the Superintendent, the Superintendent may, after
- 17 consultation with *I Maga'Lahi*, Chairperson of the Board, appoint among
- 18 any of the Associate Superintendents, or their equivalents, an acting
- 19 Superintendent.
- 20 The Superintendent *shall*:
- 21 (1) administer the day-to-day activities of the Department of Education;
- 22 (2) enforce and implement the education policies of the Board and rules and
- 23 regulations of the Department;
- 24 (3) administer federal funds/programs on behalf of the Department;
- 25 (4) serve as the Department's approving authority for the expenditure of
- 26 funds;
- 27 (5) serve as the appointing authority for all personnel employed by the

1 Department;

2 (6) be the Executive Secretary of the Board in an *ex-officio*, non- voting
3 capacity;

(7) shall submit to the Board, I Maga'lahen Guåhan, and I Liheslaturan 4 Guåhan, no later than thirty (30) days following the end of the fiscal year, a 5 detailed "Annual State of Public Education Report," which shall discuss the 6 public educational issues on Guam, and other subjects the Superintendent 7 8 may deem appropriate, and *shall* also submit such fiscal, instructional, 9 academic progress, and other information as may be required by the Board to reflect the quality of public education: 10 (8) develop and present to the people of Guam, the Board, I Maga'lahen 11

12 Guåhan, and I Liheslaturan Guåhan a "School Performance Report Card" of

13 each school, which *shall* be given in conjunction with the Annual Report;

14 (9) to perform other duties as may be required by public law to provide an

15 adequate public educational system;

16 (10) to advise the Board on the current operations and status of the public

17 schools and on other educational matters;

18 (11) to supply the Board with such information as it may require and prepare

19 the Board to make recommendations to I Maga'lahen Guåhan and I

20 Liheslaturan Guåhan for changes, additions, or deletions to public law;

21 (12) prepare a feasibility/impact/cost savings analysis for the Guam

22 Education Board recommending the potential privatization of existing

23 services for the Department.

24 (13) With the concurrence of the Board and subject to the availability of

25 funds, have the authority to hire maintenance, custodial/janitorial, and

26 cafeteria personnel.

1 (14) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or personnel rules and regulations, the Superintendent shall have the authority to assign, detail, or 2 transfer employees to various physical locations within the Department. The 3 Superintendent *shall* exercise such authority only in accordance with a 4 policy adopted by the Board and shall not (1) cause a change in position title 5 or job duties, or (2) contradict the provisions of any collective bargaining 6 agreement in effect at the time of the transfer nor violate any employee's 7 rights thereunder; 8

9 (15) Adequate Public Education Reporting Requirements. The Superintendent of Education shall submit a monthly budget status report of 10 all local and federal funds available to the Department, whether or not their 11 resources require appropriations by I Liheslaturan Guåhan. The monthly 12 budget status report shall be designed by the Educational Financial 13 14 Supervisory Commission and at a minimum contain all appropriations, transfers and adjustments, revised appropriations, expenditures to date, 15 outstanding encumbrances and unencumbered balances. The data for the 16 monthly budget status report shall be provided no later than fifteen (15) 17 18 calendar days after the end of each month, and be used by the Educational Financial Supervisory Commission for its monthly Financial Status 19 20 Designation Reports. The Educational Financial Supervisory Commission shall design an Adequate Public Education Report to reorganize the 21 22 expenditures in the monthly budget status report to the criteria established in 23 Title 1, GCA §715, and the status of compliance with the Adequate Education Act. The Monthly Budget Status report and Adequate Public 24 Education reports are to be completed *no later than* twenty five (25) 25 calendar days after the end of each month and shall be certified by the 26 27 Superintendent, acknowledging compliance or non-compliance with Title 1,

- 1 GCA § 715 and in meeting the objectives of § 3125 of this Chapter. The
- 2 reports *shall* be submitted to the Board, the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*

3 Guåhan, and I Maga'lahen Guåhan.

4 (16) Conduct periodic assessments and management and curriculum audits

- 5 of the Department for the following purposes:
- 6 (A) to ascertain whether the Department is providing an adequate public
- 7 education as defined by Title 1 GCA §715;
- 8 (B) to evaluate the effectiveness of Department administrators in
- 9 implementing board policy and directives and in fulfilling assigned
- 10 objectives;
- 11 (C) to evaluate the effectiveness of Department
- 12 instructional personnel and their ability to meet curriculum goals; and
- 13 (D) to recommend alternatives to correct systemic deficiencies and to
- 14 improve the ability of the Department personnel to fulfill assigned
- 15 objectives.
- 16 Said audits shall also identify and assess deficiencies in the Department's
- 17 organizational structure; compliance with federal and local laws and with
- 18 board policies; physical and operational security; workflow designs and
- 19 management; internal controls; staffing levels and competencies;
- 20 management levels and competencies; management practices; training
- 21 standards and practices; adequacy of facilities; physical plant management;
- 22 technical and administrative infrastructure; redundancy of systems and
- 23 procedures; productivity and quality standards; recruitment and certification
- 24 training of teachers; and recruitment, training, and staff development. Said
- audits *shall* be conducted at intervals determined by the Board of *not less*
- 26 *than* three (3) years and *no more than* five (5) years.
- 27 The Guam Education Policy Board shall solicit audit proposals for said

audits both locally and nationally. The Board *shall* create and maintain a list
 of qualified auditing firms that specialize in management and curriculum
 audits of schools and school districts. The Board *shall* transmit Requests for
 Proposale to all known qualified auditing firms and soliait through local and

4 Proposals to all known qualified auditing firms and solicit through local and5 national publications.

6 (17) Promulgate rules and regulations for the implementation and operation

- 7 of §§ 3127 through 3131 of this Title as necessary."
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Section 4. Section 3103.1 of Chapter 3, Article 1, Title 17, Guam

9 Code Annotated is repealed:

10 § 3103.1. Termination of Superintendent.

11 (a) Only the following constitute cause for the discharge of the

- 12 Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent:
- 13 (1) Failure to meet performance standards as defined by a performance

14 evaluation outline established and adopted by the Board;

- 15 (2) Holding financial interests that conflict with the conscientious
- 16 performance of his or her duties;
- 17 (3) Engaging in financial transactions using confidential or non-public

18 Department information or allowing the improper use of such information to

- 19 further any private interests;
- 20 (4) except as permitted by statute or regulation, the solicitation or
- 21 acceptance of any item of value from any person or entity seeking official
- 22 action from, doing business with, or conducting activities regulated by the
- 23 Department, or from persons whose interest may be substantially affected by
- 24 the performance or nonperformance of the Superintendent's duties, or the
- 25 duties of the Department;
- 26 (5) Knowingly making commitments or promises of any kind purporting to
- 27 bind the Department except as permitted by law;

- 1 (6) Use of his or her official position for private gain or that of others;
- 2 (7) Failure to disclose waste, abuse, and corruption to the appropriate
- 3 authorities;
- 4 (8) Failure to respect the rights and privacy of others and the use of his or
- 5 her official position, authority, or other means to injure another person for
- 6 personal reasons or malicious purposes;
- 7 (9) Fraud or misrepresentation in securing his or her appointment;
- 8 (10) Refusal or failure to perform duties and responsibilities as defined by

9 <del>law;</del>

- 10 (11) Unlawful use, possession, or sale of illicit drugs and alcohol; (12)
- 11 Criminal acts involving moral turpitude;
- 12 (13) Political activity prohibited by law;
- 13 (14) Misuse, misappropriation, or theft of government property or funds;
- 14 (15) Prohibited acts of discrimination, including sexual
- 15 harassment; or
- 16 (16) Abandonment of his or her position.
