AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 77135 TO CHAPTER 77, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE CREATION OF THE POSITION OF DEPARTMENT PSYCHOLOGIST AT THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT.

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the challenges facing the officers of the Guam Police Department are many; thus each officer must possess the ability to ascertain the potential for threat and violence in the situations they are confronted with. Additionally, they must be able to intervene in these situations decisively and responsibly as the credibility of the department, and the personal safety of the officer and, more importantly, the safety of the general public require this.

*I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that officers of the Guam Police

Department are not immune to the same professional and personal stress as members
of the general public. The stress they encounter, however, is more likely to be
heightened by the long shift hours and traumatic events they may witness from time

to time. Consequently, the stress resulting from work may adversely affect their home
 lives and vice versa.

According to the Guam Police Department, there is currently no psychologist employed by the Department. If such an individual were employed by the Department on a full-time basis, they would be able to provide services that assist officers in managing any issues they face professionally and personally. A staff psychologist would also be able to screen recruits for psychological fitness to effectively fulfill the duties and responsibilities as required by law. It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to create the classified position of Department Psychologist for the Guam Police Department.

**Section 2.** A new § 77135 is hereby *added* to Chapter 77, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read:

"§ 77135. Department Psychologist. There is established, within the Department, the position of Department Psychologist, who shall be a classified employee and report directly to the Director. The individual shall be a licensed mental health practitioner with clinical experience. Additional qualifications shall be determined by the Department of Administration and the Civil Service Commission.

The Department Psychologist shall be responsible for providing trauma debriefing, counseling and evaluation of members of the Department following major incidences or during times of personal crisis, and evaluate investigative personnel for psychological fitness for specialized assignments.

The Department Psychologist shall also evaluate potential candidates for employment for specific job titles within the Department through the use of clinical interviewing. Additionally, the Department Psychologist shall be responsible for the administration and interpretation of standard group and individual tests of personal development and intellectual capacity."

**Section 3. Enactment.** The provisions of this Act shall become effective immediately upon enactment.

**Section 4.** Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this act, the Department, in concert with the Department of Administration and the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, shall formulate, and the Department of Administration shall formally adopt, a commensurate salary for the position outlined in Section 2 of this Act.

**Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
