### AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW CHAPTER 17 TO TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE CREATION OF THE "CATASTROPHIC LEAVE POOL ACT OF 2015."

#### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 Section 1. Catastrophic Leave Pool Act of 2015, Created. A new

3 Chapter 17 is *added* to Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

6	§ 17001.	Legislative Intent.

- 1 § 17002. Nomenclature of Act.
- 2 § 17003. Catastrophic Leave, Authorized.
- 3 § 17004. Catastrophic Leave Pool, Created.
- 4 § 17005. Catastrophic Leave Pool Rules and Regulations, Authorized.

5 **§ 17001.** Legislative Intent. It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to allow employees who have been certified as having a 6 7 catastrophic illness to receive donated sick leave in excess of the maximum 8 allowed under the Family and Medical Leave Act of twelve (12) weeks in 9 any twelve (12) month period. I Liheslatura intends to create a separate pool into which donated sick leave hours may be deposited in order to accomplish 10 11 this intent. The procedures on accessing these donated hours shall mirror the 12 established procedures for leave sharing, with the exception of the cap on the 13 number of weeks that an employee can receive in donated hours, the number 14 of weeks that can be donated, and the need to designate the recipient of the 15 donated hours.

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§ 17002. Nomenclature of Act. This Chapter may be cited as the *Catastrophic Leave Pool Act of 2015.*"

18 § 17003. Catastrophic Leave, Authorized. Notwithstanding the
19 provisions of § 8.800 of Chapter 1 of Division 1, Title 2 GARR, the Family
20 and Medical Leave Act, an employee who has been certified by a physician
21 to have a catastrophic illness *shall* be eligible to receive donated sick leave
22 from the Catastrophic Leave Pool.

§ 17004. Catastrophic Leave Pool, Created. The Department of
Administration is authorized to establish and maintain a "*Catastrophic Leave Pool*" into which *shall* be deposited donated sick leave hours. For the
purposes of this Section, there shall be no limitation on the number of hours
that can be donated to the Pool.

1§ 17005. Catastrophic Leave Pool Rules and Regulations. The2Department of Administration *shall* promulgate such rules and regulations3pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law as may be necessary to4carry out the intent of this Act and *shall*, to the extent practicable, utilize the5rules and regulations established for the Family and Medical Leave Act."
