AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS (a) AND (b) OF § 12104, SUBITEM (3) OF § 12106(a), AND SUBSECTION (b) OF § 12107, AND TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (d) TO § 12104 AND A NEW § 12110, ALL OF CHAPTER 12, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO AMEND SUBITEM (1) OF SUBSECTION (a) OF § 77135 **OF CHAPTER** 77. TITLE 10, **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO **TOWING** NOTICE REQUIREMENTS, REGULATION. RATE LIENS. PENALTIES, AND DEPOSIT OF FINES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
- 2 Section 1. Towing Notice Requirements. § 12104(a) of Chapter 12, Title
- 3 16, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

1	"(a) Unless a vehicle is impounded under § 3606 of Article 6,
2	Chapter 3 of this Title 16, after performing a tow truck service, the person
3	operating the tow truck business shall:
4	(1) complete a vehicle condition report, as defined in §
5	12101(f) of this Chapter;
6	(2) within one (1) hour of arriving at the place of storage or
7	impound of the vehicle, contact the law enforcement agency having
8	jurisdiction over the area from which the vehicle was towed and
9	notify the agency of the:
10	(A) location of the vehicle;
11	(B) date, time, and location from which the vehicle
12	was removed;
13	(C) reasons for the removal of the vehicle;
14	(D) person who requested the removal of the vehicle;
15	and
16	(E) vehicle's description, including its identification
17	number and license number; and
18	(3) within seven (7) days of performing the tow truck
19	service, make reasonable efforts via phone call to the last known
20	phone number of the legal owner, registered owner, vehicle insurer
21	and lienholder (obtained from the DRT Division of Motor Vehicles)
22	and send a certified letter to the last known address of the legal owner,
23	registered owner, vehicle insurer and lienholder, where applicable, of
24	the vehicle (obtained from the DRT Division of Motor Vehicles),
25	notifying them of the:
26	(A) location of vehicle;

date, time, and location from which the vehicle 1 (B) 2 was removed: reasons for the removal of the vehicle: 3 (C) person who requested the removal of the vehicle; 4 (D) vehicle's description, including its identification 5 (E) number and license number; 6 costs and procedures to retrieve the vehicle; and 7 (F) a copy of the vehicle condition report required by 8 (G) 9 Subsection (a)(1) of this Section. For purposes of this Section, the Division of Motor 10 (4)Vehicles shall, upon the presentation of a declaration made under 11 12 penalty of perjury that a vehicle has been towed and taken into the 13 possession of a tow truck business, provide tow truck businesses with 14 the last known address and telephone numbers of the legal owner, registered owner, vehicle insurer, and lienholder, where applicable, of 15 16 the vehicle in question. The tow truck business shall furnish the 17 Division of Motor Vehicles with a copy of the notice sent pursuant to Subsection (a)(3) of this Section within seven (7) days via certified 18 19 mail after the release of the addresses of the legal owner, registered 20 owner, vehicle insurer and lienholder, where applicable." Section 2. Release of a Vehicle. § 12104(b) of Chapter 12, Title 16, 21 22 Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read: 23 The legal owner, registered owner, insurer or lienholder seeking 24 the release of a vehicle that is lawfully towed is responsible for paying the 25 towing, impound, and storage fees incurred by the tow truck business in 26 towing, impounding, and storing such vehicle in order to obtain its release; 27 provided, however, that if the tow truck business has failed to comply with

the requirements of Subsection (a)(3) and Subsection (d) of this Section, all such fees *shall* be forfeited, and the vehicle *shall* be delivered to said legal owner, registered owner, or lienholder immediately upon demand. Any tow truck business or other person responsible for or authorizing the towing, impounding or storage of a vehicle relative to this Section, but failing to comply with Subsection (a)(3) and Subsection (d) of this Section *shall* be guilty of a misdemeanor, and *shall* be liable to the legal owner, registered owner, insurer or lienholder, where applicable, of said vehicle for an amount equal to three (3) times the damages incurred by them as a consequence of said failure, together with their costs of the suit and reasonable attorneys' fees."

Section 3. Towing Notice Requirements for Company Vehicles. A new § 12104(d) is *added* to Chapter 12, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

- "(d) After performing a tow truck service of a vehicle bearing the logo of the company of ownership, including, but not limited to, rental car businesses and car dealerships, the person operating the tow truck business shall within one (1) hour of arriving at the place of storage or impound of the vehicle, contact the company to which the vehicle belongs via phone call notifying it of the:
 - (1) location of vehicle;

- (2) date, time, and location from which the vehicle was removed;
 - (3) reasons for the removal of the vehicle;
 - (4) person who requested the removal of the vehicle;
 - (5) vehicle's description, including its identification number and license number;
 - (6) costs and procedures to retrieve the vehicle; and

1	(7) a copy of the vehicle condition report required by
2	Subsection (a)(1) of this Section."
3	Section 4. Tow Truck and Impound Regulation; Rates. § 12106(a)(3),
4	Chapter 12, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:
5	"(3) any other call."
6	Section 5. Lien on Towed Vehicles; Lien Holders' Sale. § 12107(b) of
7	Chapter 12, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:
8	"(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, § 39106 of Title
9	18, Guam Code Annotated, concerning a lien in excess of Three Hundred
10	Dollars (\$300.00), shall not apply to tow truck services rendered to vehicles
11	towed and taken into possession for impound or storage by a tow truck
12	business, including, without limitation, tow truck services provided in
13	response to a peace officer dispatch call; a Motor Vehicle Division call; and
14	any other call."
15	Section 6. Penalties. A new § 12110 is added to Chapter 12, Title 16,
16	Guam Code Annotated, to read:
17	"§ 12110. Penalty.
18	(a) A violation of any provision of this Chapter is a civil
19	violation.
20	(b) Each violation shall be subject to the following penalties:
21	(1) First offense shall be subject to a penalty of up to
22	One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00);
23	(2) Second offense of the same provision within a
24	twelve (12)-month period shall be subject to a penalty of up to
25	Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) but no less than One Hundred
26	Dollars (\$100.00);

Third offense of the same provision within a 1 (3) 2 twelve (12)-month period shall be subject to a penalty of no less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00); 3 Fourth offense of the same provision within a 4 (4) 5 twelve (12)-month period shall be punishable as a misdemeanor 6 and the business license shall be suspended for up to one (1) year or until the violation has been cured. 7 All fines imposed under this Section shall be deposited 8 9 into the Police Patrol Vehicle and Equipment Revolving Fund pursuant to § 77135, Chapter 77, 10 GCA." 10 Section 7. Deposit of Fines. § 77135(a)(1) of Chapter 77, Title 10, Guam 11 12 Code Annotated, is amended to read: 13 "(1) The Police Patrol Vehicle and Equipment Revolving Fund shall be funded by, but is not limited to, OVIS fees collected and allocated in 14 15 accordance with § 3602(b) of Article 3, Chapter 3, and fines imposed under § 12110 of Chapter 12, both of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated." 16 17 **Section 8.** Severability. If any provision of this law or its application to 18 any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this law that can be 19 given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the 20
