AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2 OF PUBLIC LAW 32-114, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM TO ASSIGN EMPLOYEES TO THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GUAM (RCUOG) FOR UP TO FIVE (5) YEARS WITH THE RETENTION OF UNIVERSITY OF GUAM EMPLOYEE BENEFITS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

24	The	purposes of the Corporation shall include, but not be limited	
25	to, the pro	motion of assigned educational, scientific, and literary	
26	pursuits of	the University of Guam's grants and contracts by:	

(a) encouraging, initiating, aiding, developing, and conducting training, research, and study in the physical, biological, and social sciences, humanities, and all other branches of learning;

(b) encouraging and aiding in the education and training of persons for the conduct of the training, investigations, research, and study;

(c) furnishing the means, methods, and agencies by which the training, investigation, research, and study may be conducted, in support of the mission and best practices of the University of Guam;

(d) assisting in the dissemination of knowledge by establishing, aiding, and maintaining professorships or other staff positions, fellowships, scholarships, publications, and lectures;

(e) engaging in other means of making the benefits of training, investigations, research, and study available to the public; and

(f) taking any and all other actions reasonably designed to promote these purposes in the interest of promoting the general welfare of the people of Guam.

§ 29103. Administration.

19The affairs of the Corporation shall be under the general20management and control of the RCUOG Board of Directors.

(a) Composition of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors *shall* consist of up to ten (10) members, as follows:

 (1) Ex-officio Chief Executive Officer – University of Guam President;

25 (2) Ex-officio Member – Senior Vice President of
26 Academic and Student Affairs;

1 (3)Ex-officio Member Vice President of ------2 Administration and Finance: UOG President appointees of up to four (4) 3 (4)members (minimum of two (2) members representing the 4 5 community at large); UOG Research Council appointee of one (1) 6 (5) 7 member: UOG Faculty Senate appointee of one (1) member; 8 (6)9 UOG Board of Regents appointees of two (2) UOG (7)10 Board of Regents members; and UOG Endowment Foundation Board of Directors 11 (8)12 appointee of one (1) UOG Endowment Foundation Board of 13 Director. 14 (b) All members of the Board of Directors *shall* serve without 15 pay, but *shall* be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses while attending meetings and while in the discharge of duties and 16 17 responsibilities. 18 (c)The Chairperson of the Board of Directors shall be the President of the University of Guam. The Senior Vice President and 19 20 Vice President for Administration and Finance shall serve as ex-officio 21 members of the Board. 22 Officers and Employees of the Research Corporation. **§ 29104**. 23 RCUOG will follow all the requirements applicable to (a) 24 each major grant program and maintain internal control over 25 compliance in accordance with OMB Circulars A-133 and A-21, and 26appropriate Federal Acquisition Requirements.

(b) RCUOG employees *shall* be governed by the RCUOG Board of Directors. Rules and regulations governing the selection, compensation, promotion, performance evaluation, disciplinary action, and other terms and conditions of employment, affecting RCUOG personnel *shall* be adopted by the Board. The Board may establish or abolish positions as necessary for the purposes herein.

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(c) The Board of Directors *shall* appoint the Executive Director of RCUOG.

(d) The RCUOG Board of Directors *shall* establish an employment policy for the Research Corporation, as necessary, in administering the affairs of the RCUOG.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or 12 (e) regulation, employees of the Research Corporation shall be 13 unclassified public employees. The Board of Directors shall set the 14 employees' duties, responsibilities, salaries, holidays, leaves, hours of 15 16 work, and working conditions. The Board of Directors may grant such 17 other benefits to its employees as it deems necessary, and in accordance 18 with RCUOG's employment policy and federal employment laws. The 19 University of Guam may assign no more than two (2) University 20 employees to the RCUOG, with the approval of the RCUOG Board of Directors, for a maximum start-up period of five (5) years. These 21 22 employees *shall* retain their status as University employees during this 23 assignment period and *shall* continue to receive all University benefits 24 available to them as University employees.

(f) The RCUOG Board of Directors *shall* promulgate rules
 and regulations for hiring, employment, procurement, and property set
 forth by RCUOG Policy, and the requirements applicable to each major

1grant program and on internal control over compliance in accordance2with OMB Circulars A-133 and A-21, and Federal Acquisition3Requirements.

4 (g) Employees of the Research Corporation *shall not* be
5 entitled to any benefits conferred under Title 4, GCA - Public Officers
6 and Employees: Chapter 4 - Personnel Policy and the Civil Service
7 Commission, relating to civil service and public service; and Chapter 8
8 - Retirement of Public Employees, relating to pension and retirement
9 systems, and the appropriate collective bargaining agreement,
10 executive order, executive directive, or rule.

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§ 29105. Authorized Activities.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation, the
RCUOG is authorized to conduct the following activities:

- 14 (a) to create, adopt, amend, and repeal by-laws governing the
 15 conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers and performance
 16 of duties granted to it or imposed upon it by law;
- 17 (b) to enter into and perform such contracts, leases,
 18 cooperative agreements, grants or other transactions on behalf of the
 19 University, as may be necessary to facilitate the conduct of the
 20 authorized activities described herein;
- (c) to buy, sell, lease, rent, hold, maintain, use, and operate
 any property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or intangible, in
 accordance with the conditions under which it was received and under
 the purposes of the RCUOG;
- (d) to submit each year for the approval of the Board of
 Directors an annual budget; such budget will include projected income,
 including indirect/facilities and administrative revenue, and a cost of

operating expenses of the Corporation, as well as the distribution plan 1 of the net proceeds for the University's use, which shall include a 2 reasonable corporate reserve; the allocation of indirect/facilities and 3 administrative cost will be determined by the f of Directors, and 4 follow UOG-BOR Resolution 08-40; 5 procedures, by to receive through Universit 6 (e) ate or public 7 gifts, grants, devises, bequests, or oth , tangible, 8 sources, any property, real, personal, or absolutely or in trust, to be used and disposed of, either the principal or 9 the income there from, in accordance with the conditions under which 10 11 be accepted 11 it was received; *except*, that pro-Corpor unless approved or confirmed by the RCU vetors; 12 to facilitate multi-vear con-13 (f)14 (g)adificant acai, 1u sue and to be sued in its own name and to indemnify the 15 University against losse med specific to that activity; 16 r under terms of any gift, 17 $\langle \mathbf{n} \rangle$ to serve is trustion 18 4 2112 gift, hold, 19 to apply for, take out, receive (\mathbf{i}) administer, and dispose of copyrights, patent right, licenses, 20assignments of inventions, discoveries, processes, and other property, 21 22 rights or interests therein, the income thereof, absolutely or subject to 23 such conditions or trusts as may be attached thereto or be imposed 24 thereon, and to obligate itself to perform and execute any and all such conditions or trusts in coordination with UOG's Intellectual Property 25 26 Policy;

(k) to conduct research, studies, experiments, investigations,
 and tests in all fields of knowledge; to promote and develop the
 scientific and commercial value of inventions, discoveries, and
 processes; and to make published, and distribute the results thereof;

(l) to do any and all other acts reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives and purposes of the Corporation and the University, as approved by the University and the RCUOG Board of Directors;

 (m) to coordinate and correlate activities and projects of the Corporation with the work of government of Guam agencies for the purpose of relating research work to the economic development of Guam whenever practical or desirable;

(n) to stimulate and promote cooperative research projects and activities;

14 (o) to establish and maintain, or to assist in establishing and
15 maintaining, scholarships, fellowships, and professorships, and other
16 staff positions for the purpose of aiding in the acquisition and
17 dissemination of knowledge; and to enter into agreements or contracts
18 with other corporations, organizations, institutions, or persons for this
19 purpose and to pay the necessary and appropriate expenses therefor;

(p) to prepare, print, or publish any manuscript, research
article, report, study, discussion, reference, collection, or any pictorial
or schematic representation or group or collection thereof, whether it
belongs to or is the work of any government of Guam agency or its
employees, or the University or one of its faculty members or
employees, or the Corporation or its employees, or a contractor of
RCUOG. The printing or publication may be accomplished through

whatever person, company, or agency is deemed most appropriate by the Board of Directors.

§ 29106. Procurement.

RCUOG *shall* adopt a procurement policy approved by the RCUOG Board that is aligned with sound business practices and consistent with federal program rules and regulations as applicable to grants and contracts, such as, but *not* limited to, OMB Circular A-21.

§ 29107. Annual Report.

The Corporation *shall* submit an annual report to the University of Guam Board of Regents, *I Maga'låhen Guåhan* (the Governor of Guam), and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature).

The report *shall* include, but *not* be limited to, the Corporation's audited financial statements, including its balance sheet, statement of income and expenses, a synopsis of all ongoing research projects, and a summary of funding for each such project by the source of such funding, whether local government, federal government, or other sources, and a statement of cash flows; and progress and accomplishments during the year.

§ 29108. Dissolution.

In the event of the dissolution of the Corporation, all of its property, real, personal, and mixed, and wheresoever situated, *shall* vest immediately and absolutely in the University of Guam.

§ 29109. Special Account.

The Corporation *shall* be authorized to set up a special account for depositing moneys received from either public or private contracts, or from private or public grants, awards, or gifts. All disbursements *shall* be drawn on the special account upon checks prepared and signed,
