## AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 14 TO TITLE 2 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO REFINING THE MEANS **OF PROVIDING TRANSPARANCY IN THE LEGISLATIVE** PROCESS BY REQUIRING THAT CERTAIN INFORMATION **BE PLACED ON THE LEGISLATIVE WEBSITE.**

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15	§14101. Le	gislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the
16	internet offers the	e simplest means for government officials, the local press and the

public in general to obtain information on their government and the work of their
elected public representatives.

3 *I Liheslatura* further finds that advances in technology coupled with the falling prices of hardware, software and internet related services has made it affordable and 4 5 easy for the Legislature make information on nearly all its activities available to the public. As of July 2008, there are dozens of web hosting companies that provide 6 suitable services for less than \$20 per month. Several companies provide as much as 7 8 5,000GB of or unlimited hosting space, 3,000 email addresses and 4,000GB of monthly 9 transfer volume for less than \$20 month. Software is available free of charge or at very 10 low prices that would allow audio of sessions and public hearings to be encoded as 11 downloadable MP3 files. For less than \$500, hardware & software can procured to capture video of sessions and hearings for internet streaming or as downloadable avi, 12 wmv or mpeg video files. All of this can be done with most inexpensive office 13 14 computers and require little, if any, formal instruction for most personnel to perform.

15 It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to make such audio and video available to the public via its website along with other legislative information such as (1) notices of 16 public hearings, (2) committee reports with testimony on bills and substantive 17 resolutions, (3) all versions of the bill from introduction to passage including substitute 18 19 versions (4) and all floor amendments as proposed and voted on whether or not the amendment passed or not. It is also the intent of I Liheslatura to ensure that such 20 21 information is available on a timely basis. It is not the intent of *I Liheslatura* in the 22 adoption of this Chapter to create a legislative website or to specify the form, appearance or organization of the website, but to require that certain information as 23 24 specified herein shall be included on the website.

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1	§14102. Information not limited to the requirements of this Chapter.		
2	Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed as to limit or prevent I Liheslatura fro		
3	posting information not expressly required by this Chapter on its website.		
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5	§14103. Information to be posted on the Legislature's website.		
6	The following items shall be posted on the legislative website:		
7	(1) all Bills as introduced;		
8	(2) all Resolutions as introduced;		
9	(3) all Bills as amended or substituted;		
10	(4) all Resolutions as amended or substituted;		
11	(5) all substantive floor amendments, inclusive of authorship (does not include		
12	technical corrections);		
13	(6) all audio and video recordings of Public Hearings, roundtable meetings of the		
14	Committee of the Whole and legislative sessions;		
15	(7) all notices of Public Hearings and Roundtable meeting; and		
16	(8) all information otherwise required by Public Law		
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18	§14104. Timeframe for posting items. All bills, resolutions and floor		
19	amendments required to be posted on the legislative website shall be posted within		
20	thirty (30) days following receipt of the document by the Clerk of the Legislature. All		
21	audio and video recordings required to be posted on the legislative website shall be		
22	posted within thirty (30) days following the event.		
23	§14105. Format of documents and recordings. The Speaker shall		
24	determine the appropriate format of all documents, audio recordings and video		
25	recordings required to be posted on the legislative website. All such items must,		
26	however, be in a format that is downloadable from the website (able to be saved to the		

27 user's computer).

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§14106. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

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
