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AN ACT TO MERGE THE DEPARTMENTS OF INTEGRATED SERVICES FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES INTO THE DEPARMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE IN ORDER TO ENSURE A MORE FULLY FUNCTIONAL AND COMPREHENSIVE SERVICE TO THOSE INDIVIDUALS IN NEED

Legislative Findings and Intent : (a) Reorganization of 1 Section 1. several government of Guam departments and agencies are necessary in 2 order to promote effective management of the Executive Branch of the 3 Government of Guam, to reduce the overall size and operational costs of 4 the government in light of limited revenues and financial resources, to 5 streamline operations and services to the public, and to eliminate 6 duplicative programs and services among the different agencies and 7 8 departments,

9 (b) Within the government of Guam are two (2) agencies that provide 10 overlapping services: the Department of Mental Health and Substance 11 Abuse (DMHSA) which provides comprehensive inpatient and 12 community-based outpatient mental health, alcohol and drug programs 13 and services to the people of Guam and (2), the Department of Integrated

Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) , which serves a public
 service to coordinate and provide vocational rehabilitation and
 comprehensive community services for eligible individuals with
 disabilities.

(c) DMHSA and DISID provide similar services to individuals' with
disabilities and with the government's present financial crisis a merger of
these departments will allow for the continued ability of services to those
individuals to be continued without necessary interruption.

9 (d) Further, pursuant to Civil Case No. 04-0005, the US District Court 10 has indicated that the merger of these departments into one, would be 11 appropriate in cost measures and in ensuring that the consumers of both 12 departments would be properly served.

Section 2. Consolidation and Merger and Existing Agencies into the 13 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse except for the 14 Division of Vocational Rehabilitation which shall now be renamed the 15 16 **Department of Vocational Rehabilitation.** The Department for Integrated 17 Services for Individuals with Disabilities (DISID) and its Division of Support Services are hereby merged into the Department of Mental Health 18 and Substance Abuse (DMHSA) under the direction and control of the 19 Director and Deputy Director of DMHSA. The Division of Vocational 20 Rehabilitation, which is currently part of DISID shall stay with DISID as a 21 stand alone unit and be renamed the Department of Vocational 22 Rehabilitation. 23

Section 3. Transfer of Responsibilities. All programs, mandates, responsibilities and duties of the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities as laid out in 17 GCA Section 41101 et seq. are transferred to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse with the exception of the duties and responsibilities of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation , which shall remain with DISID (now named the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation).

8 Section 4. Funding Transfer to DMHSA. All funding given to 9 DISID, (now the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation), including 10 Federal funding, with the exception of the funding for the Division of 11 Vocational Rehabilitation shall be transferred to DMHSA.

Section 5. Transfer of Employees to DMHSA. All employees , including those funded by federal funding , with the exception of the Director, Deputy Director and her private secretary, and those employees specifically hired for the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation , shall be transferred to DMHSA. Those employees who are transferred shall be entitled to their current position and title pursuant to Section 6.007 of the Department of Administration's Personnel Rules and Regulations.

Section 6. Transfer of Equipment to DMHSA. All equipment that was obtained by DISID (now the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation), shall be transferred to DMHSA. The only equipment that will remain with DISID shall be those equipment obtained using the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation funds.

1 Section 7. Transition Period. The total responsibility currently 2 under the control of the Department of Integrated Services for Persons with 3 Disabilities shall be transferred three (3) months after the passage of this 4 bill. Immediately upon passage of this bill, the Directors of both agencies 5 shall establish timelines for the transfers as stated above as well as ensuring 6 that this transition be made smoothly during this transition period.

Section 8. Responsibilities of Federal Programs Currently under 7 DISID. Those federal programs that are currently under DISID (now the 8 Department of Vocational Rehabilitation), with the exception of the 9 10 Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, shall be taken over by DMHSA. 11 DMHSA shall ensure that all of the federal duties and responsibilities of the Federal Programs be continued without interruption. The Directors of 12 the Bureau of Budget and Management Research and the Department of 13 Administration shall provide technical assistance to ensure that the staff at 14 DMHSA is able to absorb these additional responsibilities and duties with 15 the minimum of delay. 16

17 Section 9. Should any section be deemed to be inorganic, the rest of18 the sections shall be in full force and effect.
