AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE "GUAMS HOSPITAL FOUNDATION ACT OF 2009", TO PROVIDE FOR THE FORMATION OF A NON-PROFIT PUBLIC CORPORATION FOR THE EXPRESS PURPOSE OF SOLICITING PUBLIC AND PRIVATE DONATIONS S **AND GRANTS** IN **SUPPORT** OF **CAPITAL** IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND EQUIPMENT NEEDS OF THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY THROUGH THE CREATION **OF** THE "GUAM UNIVERSAL ASSISTANCE FOR MEDICAL **SERVICES** HOSPITAL FOUNDATION"; (GUAMS) **THROUGH** ADDING A NEW SUBSECTION §80119 TO CHAPTER 80, DIVISION 4, OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.
- 3 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the Guam Memorial Hospital (GMH)
- 4 continues to serve as the island's only hospital facility which serves Guam
- 5 residents and residents of neighboring islands and the region. It is
- 6 recognized that for many years GMH has experienced serious challenges in
- 7 acquiring the finances to fund the operations and procurement of necessary

equipment and supplies to effectively service its patients. This situation can be partly attributed to the legal mandate that the hospital service every individual that seeks medical treatment at its facility. Over the years, it has been presented repeatedly by management and staff that the mandate to service every person at Guam's only public hospital facility regardless as to the patient's ability to pay has resulted in tremendous difficulties in collecting full payments from a majority of these patients subsequent to the services provided. A recent financial audit report released by the Office of the Public Auditor for fiscal year 2008 revealed that approximately 23 cents on a dollar was collected, and that these challenges continue to affect the hospital's ability to properly finance its operations and to adequately provide excellent, quality healthcare services. Despite these challenges, the hospital management, staff and medical professional personnel continue to provide the best hospital care that they can provide considering the circumstances.

Therefore, it is critical that every effort be pursued to enhance the Guam Memorial Hospital's ability to pursue financial support from as many different sources as possible to include the national, international, and local communities. A major aspect of a successful medical hospital facility is the ability to aggressively pursue additional financial resources from numerous sources, i.e. public donations, businesses, federal grants, personal contributions, and other communities, that may be utilized toward enhancing the quality of hospital services provided to our people.

1	The establishment of a non-profit community hospital foundation, of
2	which its total existence and commitment is to concentrate its complete
3	efforts toward generating revenues and soliciting equipment resource
4	contributions would directly result in the hospital acquiring additional
5	financial and resource support to augment GMH's operational
6	requirements, and ensure the continual improvement of the medical
7	services and treatment provided to the people of Guam and to patients.
8	Thus, this provision would authorize the establishment of the "Guam
9	Universal Assistance for Medical Services Foundation", that will be
10	responsible for pursuing solicitations and donations of finances and
11	resources from public and private sources to support the Guam Memorial
12	Hospital's capital and equipment needs, hereinafter known as the
13	"GUAMS Hospital Foundation Act of 2009".

Section 2. Establishment of the Guam Universal Assistance for Medical Services (GUAMS) Hospital Foundation.

A new subsection §80119 is hereby added to Chapter 80, Division 4, of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the establishment of the Guam Universal Assistance for Medical Services (GUAMS) Hospital Foundation, to read as follows:

"§80119.

GUAM UNIVERSAL ASSISTANCE FOR MEDICAL SERVICES (GUAMS) HOSPITAL FOUNDATION ACT OF 2009

§80119.1 Short Title. This Chapter shall hereinafter be known as the "Guam Universal Assistance for Medical Services (GUAMS) Hospital Foundation Act of 2009".

§80119.2. Establishment of the Guam Universal Assistance for Medical Services Hospital Foundation.

The Governor of Guam, with the assistance and support of the Administrator of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority and the GMHA Board of Trustees, is hereby authorized to establish a public, non-profit foundation corporation which shall be named the "Guam Universal Assistance for Medical Services Hospital Foundation (hereinafter referred to as the 'GUAMS Hospital Foundation')", which shall be separate and apart from the Guam Memorial Hospital and the government of Guam for the express purpose of soliciting funds and resources to augment the hospital's capital improvement and equipment resource requirements.

§80119.3. Administration of the GUAMS Hospital Foundation.

The GUAMS Hospital Foundation shall be administered by a Board of Directors, which shall hire a President who will be responsible for the daily administration and operation of the Foundation operations and activities. The President shall work for the Board of Directors, and shall serve at the discretion of the Board, in accordance with the policies and guidelines set forth for the GUAMS Hospital Foundation.

Upon establishment of the Foundation, said corporation shall, as its first action item, establish its articles of incorporation and by-laws and all

- other rules and regulations relative to operations, investments and
- 2 programs through which all private gifts, donations, endowments, services
- 3 in-kind, grants and other money shall be granted back to the Guam
- 4 Memorial Hospital Authority.
- 5 §80119.4. Authorization for the GUAMS Hospital Foundation to
- 6 Solicit and Receive Funds and Resources for the Guam Memorial
- 7 Hospital Authority.

The GUAMS Hospital Foundation is hereby authorized to solicit public or private funds, donations, gifts, service-in-kind, grants (to include federal grants), or other contributions in support of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority's overall capital facility improvement and equipment resource requirements. Such funds and resources generated shall be solely used in support of and to augment the hospital's capital improvement projects and medical equipment needs, and shall not be expended for operations. Any and all solicitations and acceptance of contributions by the GUAMS Hospital Foundation shall be in accordance with the provisions contained herein and in accordance with the laws of Guam.

§80119.5. Administration and Expenditure of Funds.

Funds received by the GUAMS Hospital Foundation *shall* immediately be deposited into a fund as established by the public corporation and shall be known as the GUAMS Hospital Foundation Fund (the Fund). Any and all expenditures made from the Fund shall be in accordance with the policies as set forth by the GUAMS Hospital

- 1 Foundation Board of Directors, or otherwise in accordance with conditions
- 2 which have been set forth by the donor on the private gift, donation,
- 3 endowment, services in-kind, or grant. The GUAMS Hospital Foundation
- 4 shall work with the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority No more than five
- 5 percent (5%) of the total sum generated from contributions, donations, or
- 6 grants shall be expended for the administration and operation of the
- 7 GUAMS Hospital Foundation.

§80119.6. Composition of GUAMS Hospital Foundation Board of Directors.

The GUAMS Hospital Foundation Board of Directors shall be composed of nine (9) members. The Governor of Guam shall appoint the charter members of the GUAMS Hospital Foundation, and each member shall serve for a term of three (3) years. Each Board of Directors appointee shall be subject to the confirmation by I Liheslaturan Guahan. The hospital administrator shall serve as the interim President of the Foundation until such time that the appointed members elect their officers, and shall upon the appointment of no less than five members convene the first official meeting of the Foundation. Upon the appointment and confirmation of at least seven (7) members, the members shall elect from among its membership its officers in accordance with its established constitution and by-laws, and shall subsequently appoint the President of the Foundation. Any official action of the Foundation shall require a majority of the

- 1 membership present, in which a quorum shall be no less than five (5)
- 2 members present at each officially designated meeting.
- The GUAMS Hospital Foundation Board of Directors membership shall be representative of the following minimum criteria:
- i. At least two (2) of its members shall have served on the GMHA
 Board, served as an administrator of the Guam Memorial
 Hospital Authority, or worked at the hospital at one time;
- 8 ii. At least one (1) member shall have significant accounting or 9 finance work experience and knowledge;
- iii. At least one (1) member shall have experience and knowledge in the field of marketing or advertising;
- iv. At least one (1) member shall have professional experience and knowledge in the law;
- v. At least one (1) member shall be appointed from the GMHA Volunteers Association; and
- vi. The remaining members shall have resided on Guam for a minimum of three (3) consecutive years immediately prior to the appointment.

In the event of a vacancy on the Board of Directors, the Governor of Guam shall appoint a replacement for the unexpired term, of which appointment shall also be subject to the advice and consent of I Liheslaturan Guahan, unless such term is to expire no more than three (3) months from the date of appointment. Employees of the Guam Memorial

- 1 Hospital Authority or actively serving GMHA Board of Trustees members
- 2 shall not be eligible to serve on the Board of Directors of the GUAMS
- 3 Hospital Foundation.
- 4 §180119.7. Requirements for Public Access and Viewing of
- 5 GUAMS Hospital Foundation Activities and Financial Reports on the
- 6 Website.
- 7 The GUAMS Hospital Foundation shall publish information
- 8 regarding its operational activities on a monthly basis. The information
- 9 may include, but is not limited to the following: monthly financial
- statements, meeting minutes and agendas, and any other information that
- the Foundation may deem beneficial to the general public.
- The Guam Memorial Hospital Authority shall make their website
- 13 available to the GUAMS Hospital Foundation for the purpose of
- 14 publishing the above required information.
- 15 §180119.8. General Reporting Requirements.
- The GUAMS Hospital Foundation *shall* transmit quarterly reports
- 17 detailing information pertaining to the contributions made to and
- 18 expenditures from the Foundation Fund to I Liheslaturan Guåhan, I
- 19 Magalahen Guahan, and to the Office of the Public Auditor of Guam. Said
- 20 reports shall be transmitted no later than 30 days upon the completion of
- 21 the third month in each quarter.
- 22 Section 3. Severability Clause.

If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
