**AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE SALE OR LEASING TO PRIVATE COMPANIES OR BUSINESSES OF THE LAND WHICH JOHN F. KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL CURRENTLY SITS IN UPPER TUMON, GUAM.**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

**Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.**

*I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that the status of John F. Kennedy High School continues to be placed in doubt. With the contempt order issued by the District Court, the government of Guam must now come up with one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) a week to satisfy the court's demand to pay the Federal Receiver. One of the options placed on the table recently was to sell of public land, primarily the upper Tumon location of the John F. Kennedy High School campus. It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to prevent this from occurring by enacting this legislation which shall prohibit the selling of, or leasing of the campus location to any private company or business. It is also the intent of this legislation that the land upon which the campus is currently situated on be used solely for the construction of and operations of a rebuilt John F. Kennedy High School.

3 F. Kennedy High School is prohibited. *I Magalahen Guahan*, the Department of Public

5 any other government agencies are hereby prohibited from selling or leasing the  
6 government owned land in upper Tumon where the site of the (JFKHS) campus sits  
7 on."
