AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §1.52 TO CHAPTER 1 OF 9GCA RELATIVE TO INFLATIONARY ADJUSTMENT OF MONETARY FINES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that

Public Law allows for individuals adjudicated for violations of Public Law and

sentenced to monetary fines to substitute community service in lieu of monetary

payment. The calculation for the conversion of the fine to community service is the

amount of the fine divided by the "prevailing minimum wage". As the minimum wage

has risen over the past three years, those opting for community services were required

to perform fewer and fewer hours of community service to pay off their fines.

I Liheslatura further finds Guam's Penal statutes lack a mechanism for the inflationary adjustment of fines.

It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to provide a mechanism for the inflationary adjustment of fines equal to the percentage increase in the prevailing minimum wage for Guam.

Section 2. A new Section 1.52 is *added* to Chapter 1 of 9GCA to read as follows:

- 1 "§1.52. Automatic Adjustment of Fines That Are Convertible To Community
- 2 Service. The amount of all fines prescribed by Public Law which are subject to
- 3 conversion to Community Service under the provisions of Article 6 of Chapter 80,
- 4 9GCA shall automatically be adjusted with each change in the prevailing Guam
- 5 minimum wage. The change in the amount of such fines, *supra*, shall be equal to the
- 6 percentage change in the Guam minimum wage."

- 8 Section 3. Paragraph (a) of Section 80.94 of Chapter 80 of 9GCA is amended to
- 9 read as follows:

- "(a) Any credit for community service against the fine imposed shall be given at any
- 12 hourly rate that equals or exceeds the minimum wage prevailing in the territory of
- 13 Guam."
