## I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURÅN GUÅHAN 2009 (FIRST) Regular Session

AN ACT TO CHANGE THE MEMBERSHIP COMPOSITION OF THE PEACE OFFICER STANDARDS AND TRAINING COMMISSION AND TO ESTABLISH MINIMUM QUORUM REQUIREMENT FOR THE COMMISSION MEETINGS, BY AMENDING SECTION 32302 (a) AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 32302.01, TO ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 32, TITLE 17 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 SECTION 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds

3 that the Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Commission was first established

4 by Public Law 24-145:2, on March 5, 1998, and further amended in its entirety by Public

5 Law 29-012:2 on September 7, 2007. The primary purpose of the Commission was the

development of regulations and minimum professional standards to serve as the basis for

the uniform recruitment operation of Guam's law enforcement entities.

8 I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that in the process of developing the

regulations and minimum professional standards the POST Commission, in accordance

with Title 17 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 32 Article 3, §32302. (c) has to hold at

least four meetings per year. The current practice of the POST Commission with regards

to setting a quorum level for meetings was to use the 50% plus one rule of all fourteen

(14) voting members of the Commission as there is no specific provision as to what

constitutes a quorum. According to the POST Executive Director, the Commission has

- 1 met at least eight times over the last two years of which only four times was there a
- 2 quorum. The Commission noted that it has been very difficult to have a quorum based on
- 3 eight (8) of fourteen (14) voting members.
- 4 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to change the membership
- 5 composition of the Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission and to establish
- 6 minimum quorum requirements for the POST meetings; by amending Section 32302 (a)
- 7 Article 3, Chapter 32, Title 17 Guam Code Annotated and by adding a new Section
- 8 32302.01, Article 3, Chapter 32, Title 17 Guam Code Annotated.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 32302. (a), Article 3, Chapter 32, Title 17 Guam Code
- 10 Annotated, is hereby amended to read:
- 11 "§ 32302. Created; Membership; Compensation; Meetings; Publications of
- 12 Procedures; Standards for Certified Training; Powers and Duties.
- 13 (a) There is hereby created a Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission.
- 14 The Commission *shall* be composed of the following seven (7) members as follows:
- 15 (1) the Chief of the Guam Police Department, *or* his designated representative;
- 16 (2) the Chief of the Guam Airport Police, or his designated representative;
- 17 (3) the Chief of the Guam Port Police, *or* his designated representative.
- 18 (4) the Attorney General, *or* his designated representative;
- 19 (5) the Director of Customs and Quarantine Agency, or his designated
- 20 representative;
- 21 (65) the Director of the Department of Corrections, or his designated
- 22 representative;

1	(7) the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs, or his designated
2	representative;
3	(8) the Superintendent of the Guam Park Patrol Officers of the Department of
4	Parks and Recreation, or his designated representative;
5	(9) the Chief of the Division of Aquatic and Wildlife Resources of the
6	Department of Agriculture, or his designated representative;
7	(10) one (1) person at large, selected by the Commission;
8	(11) one (1) non-voting representative from the University of Guam (UOG),
9	appointed by the President;
10	(12) one (1) non-voting representative from the Guam Community College
11	(GCC), appointed by the President;
12	(136) the Chief Marshal Policy Director of the Unified Guam Judiciary, or his
13	designated representative;
14	(147) the Chief of the Guam Fire Department, or his designated representative;
15	(15) the Chief Probation Officer of the Unified Guam Judiciary, or his designated
16	representative;
17	(16) one (1) non-voting representative from the Department of Administration,
18	appointed by the Director of Administration; and
19	(17) one (1) representative from the Mayors' Council of Guam."
20	SECTION 3. A new Section 32302.01 is hereby added to, Article 3, Chapter
21	32, Title 17 Guam Code Annotated to read:
22	"32302.01 Quorum Requirement.

A minimum of four (4) members present shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the affirmative votes of four (4) members shall be required to make any action of the Commission valid. No action shall be taken by the Commission at any meetings or hearings, *unless* a quorum is present."
