3           **WHEREAS**, Ms. Joleen Maañao Aguon, the second (2<sup>nd</sup>) of four (4)  
4 children of Ms. Doris Onedera Maañao Aguon, was born on March 20, 1977,  
5 in the village of *Yoña*, Guam. Her siblings are: Ms. Denise Jean M. Aguon, Mr.  
6 Joseph M.C. Gogo and Mr. Donicio O. Maañao. Ms. Joleen Maañao Aguon is  
7 the daughter Mr. Joseph J. and Mrs. Rossanna V. Aguon of *Barrigada*. Ms.  
8 Aguon was reared by Mr. Roland V. and Louisa M. Ada, with three (3) reared  
9 brothers, Mr. Roland V.M. Ada, Mr. Ken Joe M. Ada, Mr. Jason J. M. Ada, and  
10 a reared sister, Ms. Lizabeth M. Ada; and

11           **WHEREAS**, Ms. Joleen Maañao Aguon's maternal grandparents are  
12 †Mr. Jesus Atoigue and †Mrs. Agueda Santos Onedera Maañao, and her  
13 paternal grandparents are †Mr. Jose Pablo and †Mrs. Inmaculada Perez  
14 Aguon; and

15           **WHEREAS**, Ms. Joleen Maañao Aguon attended Saint Francis School in  
16 *Yoña*, Guam, and received her diploma after graduating from Guam  
17 Adventist Academy, Windward Hills, Guam, in June 1994. She attended the  
18 University of Guam from 1995 to May 2000, obtaining her Bachelor of Arts  
19 degree in Biology. She completed her Master of Science degree in  
20 Biotechnology in December 2002 from Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore,  
21 Maryland, and presented a Certificate of Completion of the Imi Ho'ola Post

1 Baccalaureate Program from the University of Hawaii at Manoa (2004 to  
2 2005); and

3         **WHEREAS**, Dr. Joleen Maañao Aguon was a nominee of the National  
4 Dean’s List in 1999 and 2000, was named to the University of Guam’s Dean’s  
5 List in 2000, and was a University of Guam Marine Laboratory recipient of the  
6 Minority Biomedical Research Support funded by the National Institute of  
7 Health (NIH) General Medical Sciences for student research, from March 1998  
8 to June 2000. Ms. Aguon received her Minority Medical Education Program  
9 Certificate of Completion from the University of Virginia School of Medicine  
10 in 2000. Her educational awards continued, achieving the Dean’s List in 2001  
11 from Montgomery College in Maryland; receiving a Professional/Technical  
12 Award in Guam (2005 to 2008); she was a Dr. Hans & Clara Zimmerman  
13 Scholarship recipient in 2006 from the Hawaii Community Foundation; and a  
14 Pacific Asia Scholarship Recipient in 2006 at the John Burns Medical School,  
15 Manoa, Hawaii. In 2006, Ms. Aguon was a nominee for the American Medical  
16 Association Foundation Minority Scholars Award, and was a scholarship  
17 recipient, from 2007 to 2008, of the Manoa, from the John and Gertrude Moir  
18 Jr. Education Foundation; and

19         **WHEREAS**, Dr. Joleen Maañao Aguon’s research experience includes  
20 being a Research Assistant I (March 1998 to June 2000) to Dr. Robert  
21 Richmond, Professor of Marine Biology, University of Guam Marine  
22 Laboratory, *Mangilao*, Guam. She was the Laboratory Assistant in the study of

1 coral reproduction (*gamete collection*, larval development and recruitment);  
2 was the Laboratory Assistant to post-doctoral research in fieldwork involving  
3 the observation and collection of *scleractinian* coral; and she studied genetic  
4 variation among *scleractinian* corals, using molecular genetic methods (DNA  
5 extractions, PCR, *agarose gel* electrophoresis); and

6         **WHEREAS**, several publications containing papers Dr. Joleen Maañao

6 of 2009 (2007); and

7           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Joleen Maañao Aguon’s teaching experience includes:  
8 1<sup>st</sup> year mentor, Imi Ho'ola Post-Baccalaureate Students (2005 to 2006);  
9 Medical School Mentorship Program (2006); and 2<sup>nd</sup> year mentor, Imi Ho'ola  
10 Post-Baccalaureate Students (2006 to 2007); and

11           **WHEREAS**, School Service for Dr. Joleen Maañao Aguon developed in  
12 2006, as she volunteered for Problem Based Learning (PBL) demonstration  
13 and coordinated Guam preceptorship for the Summer 2006 academic  
14 requirement. Dr. Aguon’s memberships include: the Internal Medicine  
15 interest group, John A. Burns School of Medicine; Geriatrics interest group,  
16 John A. Burns School of Medicine; American Medical Student Association;  
17 and the American College of Physicians; and

18           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Joleen Maañao Aguon participated in several  
19 community service programs, as a Hawaii Blood Bank Donor since 2003; as a  
20 Hospice Hawaii Respite Volunteer from 2004 to 2006; in the Blood Pressure  
21 Screening Okinawan Festival in 2005; in the American Heart Association  
22 Katrina Relief Fund in 2005; in the St. Elizabeth’s Church Health Ministry

1 since 2004 in Aiea, Hawaii; in the 2005 Blood Drive Committee Health Fair; in  
2 the Blood Pressure Screening sponsored by Americorps Guam at the *Agaña*  
3 Shopping Center in Guam on December 2007; and in the Blood Pressure  
4 Screening sponsored by the American Heart Association and Macy's in  
5 Kailua, Hawaii, in 2007; and

6 **WHEREAS**, the personal interests and skills of Dr. Joleen Maañao  
7 Aguon vary from her native *Chamorro* language and *Chamorro* cooking cuisine  
8 to competitive sporting and athletic activities, including billiards, bowling,  
9 softball and rugby; she spends her leisure time playing tennis and volleyball,  
10 and enjoys ocean sports --swimming, spear fishing, snorkeling, scuba diving  
11 (PADI certified); and

12 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Joleen Maañao Aguon's work experience began in a  
13 management position with Maañao's Catering and Food Processing on Guam  
14 from 1994 to 2000. Dr. Aguon continues her active involvement in community  
15 service on principles and values learned as a young *Chamorro* woman, based  
16 on a foundation of responsibility, character, integrity and respect for others,  
17 and family commitment enhancing her spiritual, personal, and professional  
18 growth; now, therefore, be it

4 model for our Island's youth; and, be it further


5 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary
