Relative to recognizing and commending Frank Kienow for his tremendous dedication and inspiring presence as an educator and football coach at George Washington Jr. High School and John F. Kennedy High School from 1969 to 1975.

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN***
2 ***GUÅHAN*:**

1 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow was employed in the Guam public school
2 system as an educator and football coach from 1969 to 1975. He is married to
3 Rebecca Kienow, and they have three (3) daughters: Leslie Armstrong,
4 Carmen Dominguez, and Jill Juneja; and

5 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow was an Industrial Arts teacher at George
6 Washington Jr. High School. He then became a Driver's Education teacher at
7 John F. Kennedy High School (JFK), starting in the School Year 1970. He was
8 also the head football coach and brought the team to the Island
9 Championship, where they received their only loss of the season. During that
10 year, Coach Kienow initiated the idea of creating two (2) teams for every
11 Islander Warrior sport team. The "Green Team" and "Gold Team" were
12 established, allowing for greater student participation; and

13 **WHEREAS**, Coach Frank Kienow led the JFK Islander Warriors to an
14 undefeated season and an Island Championship during the School Year 1971
15 to 1972. This was the Islander's first football championship; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow attended the University of Guam from 1972
17 to 1973 and achieved his Master of Education Administration Degree. During
18 that year, he also led the Islander Warriors to their second undefeated
19 championship season. In December of 1972, Mr. Kienow took on the position
20 as Assistant Principal at John F. Kennedy High School; and

21 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow remained as the Assistant Principal of John
22 F. Kennedy High School during the 1973 to 1974 School Year. He also

1 continued his involvement with the football team as the offensive coach.
2 During the 1974 to 1975 School Year Coach Kienow continued his work as
3 Assistant Principal and also took on the position as Acting Principal. During
4 his time at John F. Kennedy High School, Coach Kienow taught dedication
5 and instilled motivation within his students to accomplish their goals.
6 Furthermore, his contributions and leadership extended beyond the football
7 field. He played a vital role as an administrator in the educational system. He
8 initiated computer registration for student classes. He also improved
9 curriculum and provided leadership, which maintained staff cohesiveness
10 and cooperation; and

11 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow made lasting impressions upon the young
12 men he coached on the football team. After his players grew up and had
13 families of their own, many of them still refer back to the values that Coach
14 Kienow instilled in them as young men, which they have applied to
15 themselves throughout their lives; and

16 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow provided support and guidance to students
17 and football players upon their graduation from high school. He made efforts
18 to create opportunities for his players to continue their football career at the
19 college level at institutions in the mainland United States. The students and
20 players who were afforded these opportunities through their hard work and
21 accomplishments refer to Coach Kienow as being an integral force in their
22 drive to succeed at the college level; and


1 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow has expressed his dedication to his students
2 and the island of Guam throughout the years, following his relocation to the
3 mainland United States. He attends John F. Kennedy High School Reunions
4 and still makes an effort to keep in touch and get together with his former
5 students and football players. He is an individual who has made lasting
6 impressions on those who have come under his guidance; and

7 **WHEREAS**, Frank Kienow cultivated a positive environment for his
8 students and encouraged them to believe in themselves, not only in the
9 classroom or on the playing field, but in all realms of life. Coach Kienow
10 instilled his passion for hard work and achievement through his exemplary
11 actions and compassion for those around him; now, therefore, be it

12 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on
13 behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend Coach Frank Kienow
14 on his outstanding performance, dedication, and accomplishments in his role
15 as teacher, administrator, and coach; and be it further

16 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary
17 attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter
18 transmitted to Mr. Frank Kienow; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I*
