**Relative to commending and congratulating Captain Scott M. Galbreath, Commanding Officer, Naval Base Guam, June 29, 2007 to July 8, 2010, for his exceptional and outstanding service to both the community of Guam and to the Navy community.**

1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN**

2 **GUÅHAN:**

3           **WHEREAS**, over the course of more than a century, Guam citizens have  
4 taken the measure of many military leaders as Captain Galbreath truly  
5 deserves the “exceptional” and “outstanding” labels bestowed upon him here;  
6 and,

7           **WHEREAS**, Captain Galbreath enthusiastically embraced his role as a  
8 member of the Guam community, gained new friendships and contributed to  
9 fostering better understanding between the military and the island  
10 community; and,

11           **WHEREAS**, at a time when Guam is being asked to take on huge new  
12 responsibilities stemming from the military buildup, Captain Galbreath made  
13 remarkable contributions to both military operations and to the local culture, a  
14 very difficult combination to achieve; and,

15           **WHEREAS**, on the military side, Captain Galbreath’s innovative  
16 solutions and shore installation management acumen has firmly fixed Naval  
17 Base Guam (NBG) as the Pacific Fleet’s finest supply, ordnance, and logistics  
18 hub. His selfless actions, tireless efforts, and unwavering commitment to  
19 excellence led to cost savings, enhanced personnel and operational readiness  
20 and fleet family quality of life; and,

21           **WHEREAS**, as the officer responsible for Base Operations Support  
22 Services on nineteen thousand (19,000) acres of Navy property, as well as

1 logistics support to operational units of the FIFTH and SEVENTH Fleets,  
2 Captain Galbreath's superb leadership guided Naval Base Guam through a  
3 period of unprecedented growth; and

4       **WHEREAS**, while Captain Galbreath's accomplishments for the Navy  
5 are significant and far-reaching, he is entitled to take great pride in those  
6 achievements that are specifically Guam community related; and

7       **WHEREAS**, Captain Galbreath has stood four (4)-square in support of  
8 the promotion and preservation of *Chamorro* culture expanding access to  
9 historic sites within the fence line, he also:

10       • Planned and executed, in cooperation with island Mayors, annual  
11 events of cultural significance such as *Sumay* Village Liberation and All  
12 Souls Day masses as well as the *Fena* Cave massacre mass.

13       • Encouraged and supported the successful execution of the first  
14 annual *Back to Sumay Day*, allowing pre-war residents of *Sumay* and their  
15 relatives to return to the site for a day of celebration, historical displays and  
16 reminiscing.

17       • Supported the DODEA school system to encourage students to  
18 participate in the island wide Guam History Contest from which winners  
19 were announced for the summer 2010 Nationwide Competition; and

20       **WHEREAS**, in just a few of many instances of community awareness  
21 and service to Guam demonstrated by Captain Galbreath:

1           • Helped the Guam State Historic Preservation Office develop a  
2 standard operating procedure in the case of an unintended discovery of  
3 *Chamorro* remains, ensuring cultural sensitivity and correctness during  
4 the evaluation and recovery process.

5           • Promoted the positive history of Navy and community  
6 partnership by providing a monthly island history segment on the  
7 military TV channel; and

8       **WHEREAS**, Captain Galbreath’s support of the Navy Sister Village  
9 Program has outreach to the forty-one (41) island schools, twenty-one (21)  
10 Mayors and Vice Mayors and numerous island non-profit organizations,  
11 resulting in an unprecedented twelve (12) 2009 Navy-wide awards for NBG  
12 and her tenant commands that included, emphasis on Environmental  
13 Stewardship, Good Neighbor Outreach, classroom tutoring for Personal  
14 Excellence, Health and Safety and Drug Awareness; and

15       **WHEREAS**, Captain Galbreath will continue his service to his country  
16 and to the Navy, relocating to Washington DC at the Industrial College of the  
17 Armed Forces, National Defense University, Fort Lesley J. McNair with his  
18 wife Kristin and daughters Hilary and Sarah; and, now, therefore, be it

19       **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina’Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby  
20 congratulate, commend, and recognize Captain Scott M. Galbreath for his  
21 hard-work, dedication, and service to Guam and his country; and be it further

1           **RESOLVED**, that the *I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby,  
2 recognize Captain Scott M. Galbreath for his accomplishments and for  
3 attaining the highest standards of achievement as Commanding Officer,  
4 Naval Base Guam, June 29, 2007 to July 8, 2010; and, be it further

5           **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest  
6 to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted
