1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**
2 ***MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3 **WHEREAS,** Lions Clubs International is one of the world's largest
4 community service organizations with over a million members representing
5 more than forty-six thousand (46,000) clubs in two hundred six (206) different
6 countries and regions. With the motto of "We Serve", members of the Lions
7 Clubs help to meet the growing needs of the communities they serve in
8 through programs that help the blind, empower the youth, care for the
9 environment and help disadvantaged communities; and

10 **WHEREAS,** District 204 of the International Association of Lions Clubs
11 consists of twenty (20) different Lions Clubs, fifteen (15) of which are located
12 on Guam, three (3) in Saipan, and one (1) each in Pohnpei and the Marshall
13 Islands. These various clubs help to promote the vision of Lions Clubs
14 International in being the global leader in community and humanitarian
15 service; and

16 **WHEREAS,** District 204 has adopted various charitable and community
17 service projects that have benefited the people of Guam and the surrounding
18 islands. This includes, but is *not* limited to, recycling and beautification
19 projects at *Paseo, Dededo, Tamuning, Mongmong-Toto-Maite*, and also in Saipan;
20 community service projects, such as feeding the homeless at *Kamalen Karidat*,
21 assisting in the completion of houses for Habitat for Humanity, helping in the
22 Salvation Army's annual Christmas bell ringing, and visiting the sick and

1 elderly at the Guam Memorial Hospital and St. Dominic's; and also
2 participating and helping to organize events, such as the Annual Leo Youth
3 Camp, the Islandwide Diabetes Awareness campaign, the Relay for Life, and
4 various sight and hearing conservation programs; and

5 **WHEREAS**, during Lion Year 2010-2011, the various Lions Clubs under
6 District 204 will continue their mission to empower their members to serve
7 their communities by providing projects that benefit our island's most
8 disadvantaged populations, as well as projects that benefit the environment;

10 **WHEREAS**, organizing these various projects successfully will need
11 exemplary leaders who will ensure the dedication of their members towards
12 specified goals and timeframes; and
