WHEREAS, throughout her years on Guam, Mrs. Carpenter took part in various educational avenues. She committed almost twenty-five years of service at the University of Guam as a Professor Emeritus. For twenty years, she worked for the Cooperative Extension Service, where she held numerous workshops and parenting education classes in the villages of Guam. At the same time, she taught parent education once a week for 9 years, in each of the 5 public high schools of Guam to pregnant and parenting teens. Also, she served as a field instructor for social work students. In 1996, Mrs. Carpenter retired from the University of Guam; and

WHEREAS, upon her retirement in 1996, Karen began her community work as a volunteer in the area of family violence, sexual assault, and parent education. Mrs. Carpenter has taught parent education classes for thirty-one years, of which twenty-one years she had served as a volunteer. Mrs. Carpenter has helped numerous parents learn skills for better interaction with their children. In 1997, Karen joined the Family Violence Task Force and the Planning Committee for Erica's House, which subsequently opened on November 15, 2000; and

WHEREAS, since the Erica's House opening, Mrs. Carpenter has served on the Erica's House Board of Directors, and she has been an active volunteer as a grants coordinator and a representative of Erica's House in numerous outreach events. Erica's House is a family visitation center established by the government of Guam, and the Superior Court of Guam contracted its operation with Soroptimist International of Guam and Soroptimist International of the Marianas, of which Mrs. Carpenter was a member from 1997 to 1998. In addition to her involvement in various community outreach events, Karen also served on the committee that drafted the 1998 Guam Family Violence Law. This law was a revision of the previous family violence law, and increased safety for victims and more clearly delineated victims' rights; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Carpenter has also been an active support volunteer with Victims Advocates Reaching Out (VARO), and she currently serves as the Treasurer of its Board. Karen also acts as a bookkeeper for VARO and assists with administrative duties and outreach activities, as well as assisting with training. Karen is a member and past treasurer of the Guam Coalition Against Sexual Assault and Family Violence. She is a vocal advocate for survivors of family violence and sexual assault, and she continues to speak out for survivors' rights to government and non-profit organization officials; and

Karen served on the Guam Symphony Society Board of Directors for fifteen years as a general member, treasurer and president. She is currently a member of Soroptimist International of Guam and the Guam Women's Club. 


