WHEREAS, declines in smoking prevalence have occurred as a result of the implementation of multiple prevention strategies, along with the key policy initiatives established that raised taxes on tobacco products (2003 and 2009), prohibited tobacco sales to minors (1999 Synar federal mandate), created smoke-free public places (Natasha Protection Act in 2005 and GovGuam 100% Tobacco-Free Policy in 2007), and the launch of a Tobacco Quitline in 2007, along with tobacco cessation programs; and


