1 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap also served on other boards and 2 commissions, including serving as a member of the federal and local Small Business 3 Administration Advisory Council (1975); as a member of the Green Revolution Committee (1975); as a representative to the Pacific Islands Development 45 Commission (1975); as a member of the Political Status Commission (1975); and as a 6 member of the Governor's Economic Advisory Council (1975), among others; and 7 WHEREAS, in March 1979, the late David Diaz Tuncap, together with his 8 wife Dolores, returned to the private sector and founded Flowers by Tand, a local 9 flower shop that is still in operation by his family; and 10 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap served as the General Manager of the 11 Pacific Islands Club from May 1980 through March 1981; and WHEREAS, in April 1981, the late David Diaz Tuncap was selected to be the 12 13 Resident Manager of Lockheed Air Terminal, Inc. - Aviation Services Division 14 Guam, where he served until his retirement in 2006; and 15 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap was a man of honor and compassion whose passing will leave a void that will be felt for many years to come, in both the 16 17 family he loved and the island he so proudly served; now therefore, be it RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Dos Na 18 19 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan the people of 20 Guam, recognize and memorialize the late David Diaz Tuncap for his many 21 achievements and accomplishments; and does further extend sincere condolences to 22 his family on his passing, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people of 23 Guam; and be it further 24 **RESOLVED,** that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules 25 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of

1 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap married Dolores Roberto Tuncap, and 2 they were blessed with three (3) children: Antoinette Jo Ann, Nora Jean and Tania 3 Paulette: and 4 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap was a graduate of St. Mary's 5 Grammar School and St. Mary's College High School in Berkeley, California; and the 6 Territorial College of Guam, which is now the University of Guam; and WHEREAS, in 1959, the late David Diaz Tuncap began his career in the 7 8 airline industry with Pan American World Airways, Inc., working as a Passenger 9 Services Representative; and he was promoted to various positions within the Airline, 10 including as Manager of Operations and Ramp Services, and as Assistant Airport 11 Manager; and WHEREAS, in January 1975, the late David Diaz Tuncap suspended his 12 13 career in the private sector to join public service as the Director of the Department of 14 Commerce under the Administration of Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo and Lieutenant 15 Governor Rudolph G. Sablan; and WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap became the first Executive Manager 16 17 of the Guam Airport Authority in 1976 upon its creation by the Guam Legislature 18 until his departure in February 1979; and 19 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap served as a member of the Guam Visitors Bureau (GVB) for more than two (2) decades; and he was eventually elected 20 21 as Chairman, serving from 1976 to 1978, and from 1983 to 1996; and 22 WHEREAS, the late David Diaz Tuncap, as Chairman of the Guam Visitors 23 Bureau, presided in 1983 over its reorganization into a public non-profit corporation; 24 and
