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- 3 WHEREAS, the University of Guam Center for Excellence in
- 4 Developmental Disabilities, Education, Research, and Services (Guam CEDDERS)
- 5 established the Guam System for Assistive Technology (GSAT) project in 1994,
- 6 after a three year development grant was approved by the U.S. Department of
- 7 Education; and

WHEREAS, the movement to provide technology-related assistance to individuals with disabilities began with the Disabilities Act of 1998, as amended in 1994, 1998 and 2004 (P.L. 100-407 and 103-218); and referred to as the "AT Act of 1998" (P.L. 105-394), which was passed on November 13, 1998; and the "AT Act of 2004" (P.L. 108-364), which was passed on October 24, 2004, and which provided the much needed funding for the grant; and

WHEREAS, since 2004, GSAT has annually served an average of three hundred eighty-five individuals through training, and ninety individuals through device demonstrations; it reaches an estimated eleven thousand eight hundred individuals through public awareness activities, it provides about eighty hours of technical assistance to public and private agencies, and eighty short term device loans, which saves consumers an average of Four Thousand Eight Hundred Twenty-one Dollars through its reutilization efforts; and it provides around Thirty Thousand Dollars in loan funds to finance assistive technology devices, and Twenty-five Thousand Dollars to help individuals with disabilities become self-employed; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the "AT Act" is to provide financial assistance to states and territories to undertake activities that assist in maintaining and strengthening a permanent comprehensive statewide program of technology-related assistance for individuals with disabilities of all ages and in all environments; and

WHEREAS, the "AT Act" priority areas focus on activities which:

- (1) provide direct aid to individuals with disabilities to ensure that they have access to the technology they need, to the extent appropriate, and are able to secure and maintain possession of assistive technology devices so they can more fully participate in education, employment, and daily activities on a level playing field with other members of their communities;
- (2) increase the public's awareness of laws, regulations, policies, procedures, practices and organizational structures that facilitate the availability or provision of assistive technology devices and services;

(3) increase the capacity of public and private entities to provide and pay for assistive technology devices and services on a statewide basis for individuals with disabilities of all ages;

- (4) assist in developing and implementing strategies to ensure the timely acquisition and delivery of assistive technology; and
- (5) increase the active involvement of individuals with disabilities and their family members, guardians, advocates, and authorized representatives in the planning, development, implementation, and evaluation of such a program; and

WHEREAS, the Guam System for Assistive Technology (GSAT) Program is administered by the Guam Center for Excellence in Developmental Disabilities Education, Research, and Services (Guam CEDDERS), and it has developed a strong foundation in the development of a comprehensive state-wide program of technology-related assistance for individuals with disabilities within our island; and

WHEREAS, the Guam System for Assistive Technology Advisory Council is comprised of twenty-one proactive members, to include, individuals with disabilities, parents, and family members who are selected from among their peers, advocacy organizations, non-profit service providers, and government of Guam agency representatives; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of an accessible Demonstration and Training Center was made possible by the in-kind support of the Program. It is located at House #19 Dean's Circle at the University of Guam campus, and it serves as a one-stop center for our island's residents in search of assistive technology resources, providing information and referral services, awareness training, short-term device loans, technical assistance, reutilization activities, alternative financing programs, and hands-on demonstrations of different assistive technology devices; and

WHEREAS, the collaborative interagency efforts are demonstrated by the joint co-sponsorship of this year's anniversary celebration with the Guam

2 Disability Law Center; and

WHEREAS, the Guam System for Assistive Technology has promoted the

4 use of assistive technology throughout the community, and it has seen the positive
