## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL DOS NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, after several years of foreign rule under Spain, the Philippines archipelago was surrendered to the United States of America under the 1898 Treaty of Paris. Meanwhile, led by their love for their own country, the Filipinos fought with pride and valor to acquire their independence. Many brave and heroic men and

women, such as José Rizal, Melchora Aquino, Andrés Bonifacio, and General Emilio

Aguinaldo, shed blood, sweat, and tears to accomplish their mission of acquiring their

3 destiny of independence; and

WHEREAS, on June 12, 1898, Philippine General Emilio Aguinaldo declared the Independence of the Philippines at his hometown in Kawit, Cavite province, Philippines, where thousands of people from different provinces gathered to witness this historical event: the dramatic unfurling of the Philippine flag while they all joyfully sang the Philippine National Anthem, "Lupang Hunirang," also translated as "Beloved Country," followed by recital of the "Act of Declaration of Independence".

They had finally proclaimed sovereignty from the colonial rule of Spain; and

WHEREAS, at first, the United States did not recognize the declaration, but it later recognized and granted independence to the Philippines on July 4, 1946, through the Treaty of Manila. In May 1962, President Diosdado Macapagal issued a declaration, stating that Philippines Independence Day is to be observed every year on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of June; and

WHEREAS, the Filipino Community of Guam (FCG) annually observes the occasion of Philippines Independence Day, along with many Filipinos on Guam, and it organizes various events in preparation for this significant celebration: the day in which the Philippine Islands successfully gained sovereignty. To this day, the people of the Philippines continue to acknowledge their heroes. Although the members of the Filipino Community of Guam are away from their home, they ensure that the celebration is extended to our island community; and

WHEREAS, the Filipino Community of Guam (FCG) was established in 1955, and it continues to serve as the umbrella organization for all the other Filipino organizations on Guam. The FCG strives to advance our island community by
