He met and married Kuo-Ying (Clare), his wife of forty-seven (47) years, while he was stationed in Taiwan. They are the proud parents of a son, Craig, who is the General Manager of Carrier Guam Inc., Far East Division; and a daughter Cathy, PhD, a Virologist at Stanford University; and are also blessed with six (6) grandchildren. After military service, District Governor Cruz and his family formed several corporations of which he is currently the President: the DKY Development Corporation and DKY Cruz, Inc.; and

**WHEREAS**, District Governor Cruz's community service includes membership positions in several organizations such as: the Disabled American Veterans (1975 to the present); the Vietnam Veterans of America (1975 to the present); and the Fleet Reserve Association (2010 to the present), of which he is currently the President. He has also held officer or board director positions in the following organizations: President of the Young Men's League of Guam (2013 to 2016); Board Director of the Andersen Air Force Base Environmental Restoration Advisory Board (1996 to 1997); and has served as a member of the Guam Realtors Association (2010 to 2016); and

**WHEREAS**, District Governor Cruz was inducted into *Lionism* when he joined the Guam Sunshine Lions Club on December 1, 2006. He became the club's Safety Officer (Lion Year 2009 - 2010); he was President for two (2) terms: (L.Y. 2010 - 2011) and (L.Y. 2011 - 2012); and Treasurer (L.Y. 2014 - 2015). As project manager of the club, he was instrumental in the successful acquisition of a Ninety Thousand Dollar (\$90,000) wheelchair-lift Paratransit bus that was donated to Catholic Social Service on December 10, 2016 to assist the elderly and the disabled with their transportation needs. At the district level, Daniel Cruz was 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-District Governor (L.Y. 2016 - 2017), 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-District Governor (L.Y. 2017 - 2018), and the current District Governor (L.Y. 2018 - 2019); and

**WHEREAS**, as District Governor for Lion Year 2018 - 2019, Daniel Cruz's primary goals are: (1) *TO CONTINUE THE FIGHT AGAINST HUNGER*. According to LCI, "Nearly one billion go to bed hungry every night. That's why Lions and Leos are hard at work addressing this global need by providing help and hope to the children, families and neighbors who need it most." District Governor Cruz is participating in this fight by providing meals to homeless community members twice a month at various centers. The participating clubs in the district are scheduled to provide meals.

Screenings could detect pre-diabetes or diabetes. Towards this end, District Governor Daniel A.C. Cruz's corporation, DKY Cruz, Inc., has pledged Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) to the Guam Tano-Ta Branch Club, which is spearheading the Two Hundred Thousand Dollar (\$200,000) van-acquisition project; and

For over one hundred (100) years since its founding in 1917 by Melvin Jones, Lions have provided services to the needy. Although Lions are best known for saving sight, they also feed the hungry, aid seniors and the disabled, care for the environment, provide disaster relief, and meet other humanitarian needs. Members worldwide strive to live up to the Lions' motto, "HT: SERVE." and LCI encourages all Lions Clubs to align their service projects in the five (5) service areas of: (1) Hunger Relief, (2) Diabetes, (3) Pediatric Cancer, (4) Vision, and (5) Environment; and

**WHEREAS**, Lions Club District 204 is comprised of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Republic of Belau, the Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands - with over seven hundred (700) members. Each club has its own primary service projects, such as: Sight Conservation, Diabetes Awareness, Cancer Awareness, Youth Outreach, Caring for the Sick and the Elderly, and others; and
