COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill 58-33 (LS) was introduced on March 18, 2015, by Speaker Judi Won Pat, Senators Tommy Morrison, and Tina Muna-Barñes. The bill was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development on March 19, 2015.

The Committee on Finance & Taxation, General Government Operations, and Youth Development convened a public hearing on April 23, 2015, at 6 p.m. in *I Liheslatura*'s Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the hearing agenda was Bill 58-33 (LS). The hearing convened hearing convened at 6:04 p.m. and was adjourned at 7:17 p.m.

II. TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Chairman Michael San Nicolas: We are now on the next agenda item, Bill No 58-33. I will go ahead and yield to author of the legislation, Speaker Won Pat, for her opening statement.

Speaker Judi Won Pat: Thank you very much. I authored Public Law 32-19 that authorized the use of mileage earned through government of Guam credit card purchases of airline tickets to support student travel involving academic, sport, and cultural activities. The intent of the law is to help provide students the means to participate in various academic, sports, and cultural activities off island which will contribute to strengthening their academic, physical, and social development. I introduced Bill 58, which was co-sponsored with Senators Morrison and Barnes, at the request of the Department of Education to expand the program to include all purchases rather than just for travel with government of Guam credit cards. Also, the bill would allow the Superintendent to appoint a committee to oversee the program and clarify that this program is only for GDOE students. The law originally stated that it was the Superintendent, who is superintendent for close to 32,000 students... it would be burdensome for him to make that decision; we want him to select the committee that would help him in that process. Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman San Nieolas: Thank you, Madame Speaker. For the record, we do have written testimony submitted by the Superintendent. We do have Mr. Malay who has signed up to give testimony on behalf of the Department of Education. Please join us, sir.

Mr. Rob Malay: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and good Senators. I'd like to start by saying thank you to Speaker Won Pat and Senator Morrison for having your staff come over and meet with us to discuss some of the hurdles and obstacles with the implementation of this program. We are in full support of any opportunity that does enhance the learning process here on island through academic, sports, and cultural travel, which provide opportunities for our students that they might be unable to attain here and open their eyes to a greater world out there. We recommended that the provision in the law expand to all credit card purchases and not just credit card purchases for travel as it is very difficult, as we were trying to implement this, to be able to distinguish what mileage was earned through travel purchases because your mileage statements don't disaggregate that information. They don't give you a statement that says, "you earned 1,000 miles for grocery purchases; 1,000 miles for travel purchases"; it isn't done that way. So, when we sat down with the staffs of the two Senators, we were able to work through that and we're recommending that an amendment be made that would include travel mileage that is earned through all credit card purchases to benefit students. This program will go a long way. Our students do the fundraising to have these opportunities whether it be a sports team, Close Up, Mock Trial, or whatever the case may be. Simon Sanchez High School just placed fifth in the National ProStart competition for culinary arts. We have our ROTC program competing in the Golden Bear competition this weekend and they have done very well and have been very successful in those national competitions. We want to be able to afford these opportunities four our students and being able to access travel mileage to offset costs will go a long way in providing those opportunities for our students. We do support the amendments and we did make recommendations for consideration. I want to thank you all for the efforts in working with our public school students and providing them with these awesome opportunities.

Chairman San Nicolas: Thank you, Superintendent Malay. Did anyone have questions for this individual?

Senator Tom Ada: I'm a little disappointed that we don't have the airlines here to provide testimony to inform us as to whether they would be willing to go through the administrative processing of sorting out travel mileage to go to a certain account and everything else stays wherever. I recall the mileage program for medical referrals. I don't know if it ever got implemented because the airlines have always said that they don't want to hassle with that. I'm disappointed that the airlines are not here to say if they'll participate in this program. Thank you.

Chairman San Nicolas: Thank you, Senator Ada. Does anyone else have any statements or questions?

Senator Mary Torres: Mr. Malay, in looking at the bill, on line 7... the use of the words "government of Guam" was struck from the description of credit cards that are used for purchases. In the Department, are purchases sometimes made with personal credit cards and then reimbursed by the Department?

Mr. Malay: I think that the intent of this bill is not just for the Department of Education but for all government of Guam agencies particularly the Department of Administration, which does make purchases with credit cards. We don't have a Department of Education credit card. There are travelers who will secure accommodations with their personal credit card and receive their per diem but they don't necessarily get charged on their credit card when they receive their per diem and are able to offset it. This may occasionally happen. You'll see in Superintendent Fernandez's testimony the recommendation he has in regard to some of the language that was presented in some of the amendments. There's a recommendation for consideration to include all purchases not specifically travel. Quite frankly, you could have an agency that makes all of their other purchases and uses those miles to afford the travel without having to purchase travel through a credit card or other means. So, the recommendation that we out forth is all purchases with credit cards not just purchases for travel.

Senator Torres: But my question is specific to the credit card that is used and the miles that are accrued on the credit card. My question is, in your Department, is it a usual practice that travelers or authorized employees will use their personal credit cards and then seek reimbursement? Are you aware of that type of practice?

Mr. Malay: Not for purchase of airline tickets, no. That's not done through the Department. They don't use their personal credit cards. That goes through our business office and it goes through fair competition with getting price quotations and determining which one has the best criteria in order for the traveler to attend. We don't pay with credit card for airline tickets. However, in order to reserve a hotel room, people do need to put a credit card up front to hold that room otherwise they'll get there and won't have an accommodation. That's the common practice.

Senator Torres: That answers my question because the whole management of the surrender of miles and that sort of thing becomes a different type of administrative effort and that's why l asked if it is, on occasion, an occurrence.

Chairman San Nicolas: Do any other colleagues have questions? Thank you, Mr. Malay. Speaker, did you want the Committee to work on getting this reported out for session next week? Or did you want to inquire with the airlines?

Speaker Won Pat: We will work with your office and make that determination. I do know that when this was first introduced, there was the risk of actually losing United to participate in using the mileage for both the medical or for the students and that's why the changes were made. That was the reason for this; they do not want... They allowed and put on their website that if you want to contribute your miles, you can go there and the Ayuda Foundation is listed as one of those sites to make the contribution. But they were almost threatening that if one stopped making it a requirement for all the government of Guam employees to put their mileage into the Ayuda Foundation, because we were not requiring this of the competitor, Delta, therefore there is no requirement of mandatory deposit of their mileage. We could no longer garnish those so we decided that it would be best, through government credit card purchases, that would be the way to get the mileage for our students. The airlines didn't come and testify at that time; it was just a personal discussion I had with United and Delta but they would not come to testify.

Chairman San Nicolas: So, we'll work with you on the outcome of the bill. Did you want to make any closing statements on the bill?

Speaker Won Pat: I just want to say congratulation to Mr. Malay. We are sad that we are going to lose you but I understand that you were selected for Superintendent in New Hampshire. Congratulations.

Chairman San Nicolas: If there are no other testimony or questions, we will conclude the hearing on Bill 58-33.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

On the recommendation of the Department of Education, the Committee has included an amended version of Bill No. 58-33 (LS).

Hafa Adai, Senator San Nicolas,

Thank you for allowing me to submit this testimony for Bill 58-33, An Act to amend § 23111(b) and § 23111(e)(3) of Chapter 23, Division 2, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, relative to the use of governmental travel mileage benefits for off-island student travel involving academic, sports and cultural activities. I am in full support of finding solutions to making learning opportunities more accessible for our students and believe that using travel benefits in this regard will help facilitate this. The Guam Department of Education has a number of travel opportunities for our students that enrich the experience in onr classrooms and on our playing fields.

The difficulty with implementing this program is being able to identify the miles that are accrued through credit card purchases specifically for travel. The mileage that is earned through credit card purchases is not itemized in a manner that would clearly identify what was earned for travel purchases. Additionally, government agencies could use mileage earned for all other purchases to fund travel and thus not need to purchase airline tickets for travelers. It is our recommendation that the committee consider the following language for this amendment:

"(b) Medical Referral and Education Mileage Program. There is hereby created within the government of Guam an accrued mileage program for the use of travel mileage earned as a result of travel paid all purchases made by the government of Guam through the use of government of Guam credit card purchases."

This amendment will make it easier for students to avail the travel benefits for academic, sports and cultural activities to enrich the learning process in our schools. Thank you, again, for the opportunity to provide this testimony and if you have any further clarifications that I may be of assistance with, please let me know.
