1/ The proposed legislation seeks to expedite the intent of U.S. Public Law 114-328 (Guam World War II Loyalty Recognition Act) relative to payments of adjudicated claims for Guam's World War II survivors by: 1) establishing a local war claims fund to be known as the 75th Guam Liberation War Claims Fund, and 2) authorizing the Governor of Guam to utilize her transfer authority to transfer a sum not to exceed Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7.5M) into the 75th Guam Liberation War Claims Fund from appropriations contained in Public Law 34-116 (FY 2019 Budget Act). All funds transferred into the newly established 75th Guam Liberation War Claims Fund shall be used for the sole purpose of awarding compensable Guam victims with certified claims by the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission.

The Bureau projects that there are anticipated lapses within Executive Branch appropriations in FY 2019 to facilitate the transfer of funds into the 75th Guam Liberation War Claims Fund.
