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Comments on Bill No. 20-35 (COR)

Legislative Bill No. 20-35 (COR) seeks to amend Section 8, Chapter XI of Public Law 34-116 by reducing the appropriation "to fund the Guam Retirement Security Plan established by Public Law 33-186," from \$500,000 to \$300,000. The \$200,000 availed by the amendment would then be appropriated to the Guam Police Department for security cameras and related equipment.

It should be noted that, in BBMR's Fiscal Note for Bill No. 381-34 (LS), which proposed to secure funding from the same appropriation for the Security Plan in P.L. 34-116, the Government of Guam Retirement Fund (GGRF) passed Resolution No. 2017-05. The Resolution stated, in part, that absent a continuing fund source, it could not effectuate the Guam Retirement Security Plan (GRSP) and, as such, would not be utilizing the appropriation made for the GRSP.

Based on the foregoing, the source of funding for the proposed appropriation to the Guam Police Department appears to be viable.
