Footnote: 1/ Bill No. 81-35 (COR) seeks to add a new § 5008.4 to Chapter 5, Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, and additionally, it seeks to add a new Chapter 56, Division 11, to Title 22 of the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations. The intent is to mandate, to the maximum extent practicable, the purchase of energy efficient products by the Government of Guam. The Administrative Rules and Regulations would be amended to mandate that all branches, agencies, instrumentalities, and public corporations shall purchase Energy Star products, as designated by the federal Environmental Protection Agency, when such products are available. Provisions for waiver of the requirements, if certain criteria is met, would be provided under § 56101(c) of the Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations if the subject bill is passed. Lastly, while it is noted that additional review procedures are required to be implemented within government entities to ensure that the intent of the bill is carried out, such costs are normally absorbed within their annual budgets.
