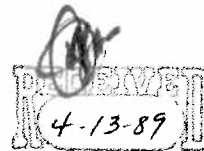





AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF  
EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND  
DOLLARS (\$825,000) TO THE DEPARTMENT  
OF EDUCATION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NEW  
CLASSROOMS AND BUILDING RENOVATIONS  
AT OCEANVIEW HIGH SCHOOL, AND FOR  
OTHER PURPOSES.

1           BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:  
2           Section 1. Legislative findings. There exists an emergency  
3 overcrowding situation in school because of the lack of classroom space  
4 caused by a fire destroying four (4) classrooms at Oceanview High School  
5 in Agat. The Legislature also finds that no immediate administrative action  
6 was taken to restore demolished classrooms, nor were necessary funds  
7 requested, appropriated or identified to either immediately repair or replace  
8 said demolished classrooms since the fire which occurred on April 9, 1988.  
9 The Legislature finds that to provide the student population of Oceanview

1 High School an equal educational opportunity it must provide twelve (12)  
2 classrooms to accommodate the student population. The school building was  
3 designed as a junior high school facility and is inadequate to meet a high  
4 school curriculum including science, vocational and career training courses.  
5 The lack of classroom and storage spaces has limited the number of  
6 advanced courses in vocational, business as well as college preparatory  
7 courses.

8 Section 2. Seven Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$720,000) are  
9 hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Education  
10 for the purpose of constructing twelve (12) new classrooms and building  
11 renovations as specified in Section 1 of this Act. Speed of completion is to  
12 be an important consideration in the decision as to the type of construction  
13 to be utilized. The requirements of the procurement and bidding laws are  
14 waived for this project due to its emergency nature.

15 Section 3. One Hundred Five Thousand Dollars (\$105,000) are hereby  
16 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Education to  
17 purchase collateral equipment to furnish the twelve (12) new classrooms.

18 Section 4. Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$65,000) are hereby  
19 appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislature for the replacement  
20 of the supplies and materials and the repair and replacement of the  
21 equipment of the Committee on Ways and Means, and for its office  
22 relocation, all as made necessary by the fire at its old office.



As presiding officer, I hereby find that emergency conditions exist involving danger to the public health or safety in the lack of adequate facilities at Oceanview High School, and I therefore authorize the waiver of the requirement for a public hearing on Bill No. 516 (COR), pursuant to §2103, Title 2, Guam Code Annotated.

In doing so, however I must point out that the emergency situation exists because of the failure of the executive branch to take any effective action on the problem that arose because of the classroom fire that took place almost a year ago. If appropriate action had been taken in timely fashion, there would be no emergency such as I now find to exist.

As to Section 4 of the bill, I further find such emergency conditions exist with respect to its provisions since the fire that destroyed the office of the Committee on Ways and Means necessitates immediate action to permit the Committee to continue to perform its vital public functions.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$725,000.00) TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NEW CLASSROOMS AND BUILDINGS RENOVATIONS AT OCEANVIEW HIGH SCHOOL, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative findings. There exists an emergency overcrowding  
3 situation in school because of the lack of classrooms space caused by a fire destroying  
4 four (4) classrooms at Oceanview High School in Agat. The Legislature finds that  
5 to provide the student population of Oceanview High School an equal educational  
6 opportunity it must provide ten classrooms to accommodate the student population.  
7 The school building was designed as a junior high school facility and is inadequate  
8 to meet a high school curriculum including science, vocational and career training  
9 courses. The lack of classroom and storage spaces has limited the number of advanced  
10 courses in vocational, business as well as college preparatory courses.

11 Section 2. Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) are hereby appropriated

1 from the General Fund to the Department of Education revenue for the purpose  
2 of constructing ten new classrooms and building renovations as specified in Section  
3 1 of this Act. Speed of completion is to be an important consideration in the decision  
4 as to the type of construction to be utilized. The requirements of the procurement  
5 law are waived for this project due to the emergency nature.

6 Section 3. Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) are hereby appropriated  
7 from the General Fund to the Department of Education to purchase collateral  
8 equipment to furnish the ten (10) new classrooms.

9 Section 4. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) is hereby appropriated  
10 from any unappropriated surplus in the General Fund to the Committee on Ways  
11 and Means of the Twentieth Guam Legislature for the replacement and/or repair  
12 of supplies, materials and equipment and for office renovation and relocation costs  
13 made necessary by the fire at its office location on March 3, 1989.
