AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SUBPARAGRAPH (b) OF §4301 OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO INCREASE THE CONTRIBUTION MADE BY THE GOVERNMENT UNDER GOVERNMENT SPONSORED HEALTH PLANS FOR RETIRED EMPLOYEES AND THEIR SURVIVORS.


LEGISLATIVE STATEMENT. The Legislature finds that the government of Guam employees, both active and retirees, are entitled to benefits comparable to those of other workers or retirees, it being in the best interest of the people of Guam to attract and retain qualified employees for public service. Since the cost of health care continues to rise at even higher rates than the Consumer Price Index, and premiums for health insurance also rise to meet spiraling medical costs, it is reasonable and just to assign the costs of these benefits on a equitable basis.

Since the cost of benefits utilized by active employees compared to retirees is an accurate depiction of how benefits are used, and since a low cost to the active employees of such benefits is a means of keeping qualified employees, and since the people of Guam recognize the debt owed to retired government employees for their years of valued services and wish to assure them that increases in the cost of their medical benefits will have a minimal impact on their hard-earned annuities; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subparagraph (b) of §4301 of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:

"(b) All participation by employees in such contracts of insurance shall be on a voluntary basis. Effective in the next contract following the enactment of this subparagraph, the government's contribution for health and dental insurance shall be uniform within each class (including separate classes and rates for retired employees and their survivors) for all competing plans and shall not be less than fifty percent (50%) of the lowest premium for a single employee, except that the government shall increase the contributions it makes on behalf of a retired employee or survivor of a retired employee so that the retired employee or the survivor of a retired employee contributes no more than an active employee who is otherwise in the same class."
