COMMITTEE REPORT

BILL 769

"AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000) FROM THE TOURIST ATTRACTION FUND FOR THE GUAM VISITORS BUREAU FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING THE MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF THE SAN VITORES BOULEVARD SIDEWALK LIGHTS"

A public hearing was conducted by the Committee on Tourism and Transportation on Monday, July 24, 1989, at 9 a.m. The hearing was chaired by Senator John Perez Aguon (Tourism and Transportation chair) with Senators Doris Brooks, Ted S. Nelson, Edward D. Reyes and Tony Unpingco.

TESTIMONY

Richard Williams (Chairman of the Tourist Attraction Fund Committee of the Guam Visitors Bureau) and Bill Gibson (GVB Board member), testified as private citizens. In their oral testimonies, they expressed a preference for overhead lighting on San Vitores Boulevard. The existing ground lights are undesirable because of the maintenance problems and the limited capability for illumination. They felt that the Department of Public Works should conduct a feasibility study for the installation of overhead lighting.

The GVB Board of Directors sent written testimony supporting Bill 769.

H. Mark Ruth, President of the American Institute of Architects Guam and Micronesia Chapter, submitted written testimony (Exhibit A) supporting Bill 769. They are also encouraging the Legislature to expand the program to include downtown Agana, other beaches and parks on Guam.

Questions raised at the hearing concerned the procurement practices of GVB.

ANALYSIS

The presence of hotels along San Vitores Blvd. generates a large number of people who depend on the sidewalk. Their safety is at a

risk because of the inadequate lighting that presently exists along the road. The bill intends to solve this problem.

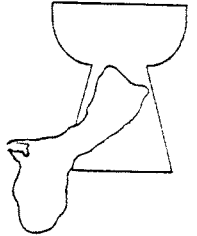
RECOMMENDATION





The Guam Visitors Bureau wholly endorses project(s) that would enhance our island's visitor plant. By making our island an attractive destination, visitors will continue to flock to our shores. Since the birth of tourism in Guam, our major selling traits were the three S's: sand, sea and sun. Our lush, tropical island with its natural beauty lured thousands of Japanese tourists to frolic in the sand and enjoy our warm weather.

As tourism matured in Guam, we realized that we must enhance our island's natural attributes with complementary tourist attraction facilities. In light of fierce competition for the tourist dollar from other tourist destinations, we acknowledge that in order to remain competitive, we must keep our product (Guam) in its pristine state and encourage the development of projects that would contribute towards making Guam a truly, unique tourist destination.

The following bills would address our on-going concerns to "Keep Guam Beautiful". Since August 1987, we submitted a prioritized list of capital improvement projects (CIP's) to the Legislature totalling over \$7 million. In subsequent testimonies on related bills at the Legislature, we have continued to mention our CIP list. More recently, on March 30, 1989, we submitted an updated list totalling over \$23 million.

The proposed bills are contained in our comprehensive package. The Board approved these projects then and fully endorses these projects today. Our position is as follows:

Bill #767 GVB endorses the concept of a botanical garden on Guam so that visitors and residents alike would have an additional attraction to enjoy. GVB would have no objections to coordinating the design and construction of this project. The approach that GVB currently utilizes with its other TAF-CIP projects would be followed in the coordination of efforts to create a new attraction. We would like to request an amendment to the bill by including "Guam Botanical Garden and related park facilities."

Bill #768 For the past couple of years, the GVB has been administering the Tumon Beach Maintenance Project in coordination with DPW. Tumon Beach is now well maintained, enjoyed by both visitors and residents alike.

With respect to the Park Restroom Maintenance Project, \$241,000 was appropriated for the rehabilitation, maintenance and security of park restrooms. This project is just now getting started since contractors were not available to perform the scope of services.

The GVB fully endorses continued funding for both projects but would like to request that administration of the projects remain with the GVB.

Bill #769 The safety of our visitors continues to be of paramount concern for the GVB. We noticed that many of the sidewalk lights are inoperable and pose a threat to pedestrians. In our request to the Legislature for funding, we asked that funds be appropriated for one(1) year and to turn the project over to the appropriate agency thereafter.

Bill #771 The GVB fully endorses this project. We recommend, however, that the villages undergo a major clean-up campaign prior to beautification efforts.

In light of the above, the GVB fully supports passage of the proposed bills with minor amendments. We sincerely appreciate the Legislature's efforts in keeping our island an attractive tourist destination. By doing so, we can look forward to the continued growth of our visitor industry.
