### COMMITTEE REPORT

#### **BILL 823**

"AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A RECREATIONAL FACILITY IN UMATAC, TO DO PASS AS AMENDED."

A public hearing was conducted by the Committee on Ways and Means on Tuesday, July 25, 1989. The hearing was chaired by Senator Ted S. Nelson (Acting chair of Ways and Means Committee) with Senators John Perez Aguon, Elizabeth Arriola, Ernesto Espaldon and Pilar C. Lujan.

#### **TESTIMONY**

The first witness before the Committee was Commissioner Albert T. Topasna of Umatac. Through an oral testimony, he supported Bill 823 by explaining that Umatac was the only municipality in the south that had no multi-purpose court. He emphasized that the children and the other members of the community in Umatac are in need of such a facility.

The second witness was Vicente "Ben" Q. Sanchez, testified as a private citizen and resident of Umatac. In his testimony (see Exhibit A), he endorsed the bill but he questioned the location. He claimed that the proposed site was inappropriate because it was a.) between a highway and a concrete wall of the Office of the Commissioner and b.) would be adjacent to the boat ramp. The boat ramp is scheduled for construction and the multi-purpose court would deprive the boat ramp of a parking space. He informed the Committee members that the Umatac Planning Council has a municipal plan for a civic center which incorporates a multi-purpose court.

Sen. Arriola supports the multi-purpose court. She stated that during the mass for the funeral of Mr. Jose Quinata, the son mentioned that this was one of Mr. Quinata's dream for Umatac.

Sen. Nelson stated that the Committee should grant the \$150,000 appropriation to the Planning Council but that the Dept. of Public Works and the Dept. of Parks and Recreation should be involved.

Sen. Aguon suggested the need to review the plans because of the problems raised by Mr. Sanchez and articulated his concern that maybe the appropriation was premature. He also requested for a written testimony.

Sen. Espaldon agreed with Sen. Nelson and pointed out the need to readjust according to the Council's plans.

Michael Reidy, Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, agreed with Senators Nelson and Espaldon and supports the appropriation. He emphasized that the Municipal Planning Council should be involved.

#### ANALYSIS

All the municipalities of the South have continually expressed their feeling of neglect when they compare their infrastructure with that of the North. In the case of Umatac, it appears that this appropriation is but a small measure whereby the Legislature can begin to address their concerns.

The Committee finds that the discussion regarding the problems with the proposed site of the multi-purpose court and the concerns raised are valid.

The fiscal note from BBMR includes the appropriation of \$150,000 from the General Fund.

#### RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways and Means recommends that Bill 823 be passed by the Twentieth Guam Legislature but that the site for the multi-purpose court be determined by the Umatac Municipal Planning Council.

TESTIMONY OF VICENTE Q. SANCHEZ BILL NO. 823

MR. CHAIRMAN, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE CONDUCTING THIS HEARING ON BILL 823, RELATIVE TO APPROPRIATING \$150,000 TO CONSTRUCT A MULTI-PURPOSE COURT IN THE VILLAGE OF UMATAC. IT SEEMS TO ME THAT THE BILL IS GEARED TO RENOVATING THE PRESENT MUNICIPAL BASKETBALL COURT SO THAT IT CAN ACCOMODATE AS MANY ACTIVITIES AS POSSIBLE, THUS, A MULTI-PURPOSE COURT.

THE INTENT OF THE BILL IS TRULY COMMENDABLE BUT REALIZING IT SEEMS FAR FETCH BECAUSE OF THE PRESENT PHYSICAL LOCATION OF THE COURT AND ITS RELATIONSHIP WITH OTHER FACILITIES, PRINCIPALLY THE COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE FOR INSTANCE. IN THE VERY NEAR FUTURE, ANOTHER MAJOR FACILITY, A BOAT RAMP WILL BE ERECTED APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED (100) FEET AWAY FROM THE COURT. THE FLOW OF TRAFFIC ALONE IS ENVISIONED TO BE A PROBLEM, LET ALONE, EVENTS WHEN THEY OCCUR AT THE SAME TIME.

THE MAIN REASONS FOR PROBLEMS TO APPEAR IN DEVASTATING PROPORTION IF NOT CAREFULLY CONSIDERED IS THAT THE AREA HAS BEEN CONTEMPLATED TO ACCOMODATE THE CIVIC CENTER, THE AREA IS HIGHLY LIMITED IN SPACES, PUBLIC USES TREND IS SIMPLY PHENOMENAL.

THE PRESENT COMMUNITY CENTER WAS BUILT NOT WITHOUT OBJECTION BY SOME RESIDENTS THAT IT WAS NOT IDEAL LOCATION, DESPITE THE FACT THAT AT THAT TIME IT WAS THE ONLY AVAILABLE LOCATION.

I REALIZE THAT THE BILL'S INTENT WAS TO CONSTRUCT A COURT EITHER NEAR THE LOW-RENT HOUSING AT WHICH LOCATION I URGE SUPPORT AND PASSAGE. NEVERTHELESS, I FEEL THAT A PRIORITY EXIST IN WHICH THE CURRENT COURT AT THE VILLAGE, TOGETHER WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE NEEDS TO BE ADDRESSED.

I AM INCLINE TO SUPPORT FUNDING THE REPLANNING AND MODERNIZATION OF A CIVIC CENTER USING THIS BILL AS A SEED MONEY. IT SEEM THAT MORE BENEFITS MAY BE DERIVED FROM A CIVIC CENTER RPOVIDED OF COURSE THE COMMUNITY'S PROPOSAL IS FOLLOWED.



AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR A RECREATIONAL FACILITY IN UMATAC

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Works for the purpose of constructing a Multi-Purpose Court in Umatac.

Section 2. The Umatac Municipal Planning Council shall coordinate the project authorized by this Act with the Department of Parks and Recreation and the Department of Public Works regarding its implementation. The contracting officer for the project shall be the Director of the Department of Public Works.
