

PREFACE:

The Committee on Energy, Utilities and Consumer Protection and the Committee on Ways and Means conducted a public hearing on Wednesday, July 19, 1989 at 1:00 p.m. in the Legislative Session Hall on BILL NO. 217: AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$1,300,000.00) FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING A SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$625.00) LUMP SUM COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE FOR GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREES OR THEIR SURVIVORS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1990 ONLY. Committee Members present at the public hearing were: Senator Don Parkinson, Chairman; Speaker Joe San Agustin; and Senator Doris Brooks, member.

TESTIMONY:

Appearing to testify before the Joint Committee was Mr. Atanacio Gutierrez, Director of the Guam Retirement Fund. Mr. Gutierrez submitted a written testimony labeled Exhibit "A". In this testimony, Mr. Gutierrez stated that the proposed amount \$1.3 million to fund a \$625 lump sum cost of living allowance for retirees and survivors for FY 1990 is not an adequate amount. As of July 15, 1989 there are 2,750 pensioners on the Fund's payroll, however, a projected increase of 250 pensioners is expected for the remainder of FY 1990. Therefore, it is recommended that the amount of appropriation be increased to \$1,875,000. Mr. Gutierrez stated he is in support of the passage of Bill No. 217.

JOINT COMMITTEE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

STATEMAN OF CALCOUNTERL CALCUS

The Committee on Energy, Utilities and Consumer Protection and the Committee on Ways and Means find that based on the mandate of Public Law 19-19, Section 57, and the quarterly report by the Department of Commerce, a Cost of Living Allowance for all retirees or their survivors is justifiable. The Joint Committee therefore recommend the passage of Bill No. 217, as Substituted.

Dear Senator Parkinson:

Thank you again for allowing us to submit comments on a bill before this committee affecting retirees and survivors of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund.


Bill No. 217 (COR) proposes a \$1.3 million appropriation to fund a \$625 lump-sum cost of living allowance for retirees and survivors for FY 1990. The appropriation recommended in the bill is not adequate to fund the COLA for all retirees and survivors (pensioners). The \$1.3 million translates to a payment of \$625 for 2,080 retirees and survivors. As of July 15, 1989 there were 2,750 pensioners on the Fund's payroll. We project an increase of 250 for the remainder of this FY through the end of FY 1990. Therefore, the intent of the bill to provide a cost of living adjustment of \$625 to every pensioner has a shortfall of \$575,000. We, therefore recommend that the amount of appropriation be increased to \$1,875,000.

We would like for the committee to note that a similar bill, Bill No. 805, has been introduced for the continuation of the \$419 lump-sum COLA.

In summary, we support the intent of Bill No. 217 (COR), and hope the committee will note our comment for an increase in the appropriation to cover all current and prospective pensioners.

AN ACT TO ADD SUBSECTION (8) TO SECTION 12101, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, DEFINING INDIVIDUAL, FAMILY AND MARRIAGE THERAPISTS FOR LICENSING, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. A new subsection (s) is added to Section 12101, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

> "(s) 'Individual, Family and Marriage Therapist' means a skilled individual qualified by practical and academic training to provide planned intervention to help the client(s) enlarge competencies and increase problem solving skills and coping abilities. Licensure requirements and scope and procedures of practice for such individuals shall be promulgated by the Board of Allied Health Examiners."

Section 2. WHEREAS, U.S. Public Law 91-596, also known as the "Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970", was enacted to assure safe and healthy working conditions for private sector employees; and

"(f) Annually, on or before May 1, to compile a cost of living index based on consumer prices and other related information and to determine a rate of inflation for the previous calendar year, for use by the Government of Guam Retirement Fund and the government of Guam in adjusting benefits received under the Government of Guam Retirement Fund law and the salaries of employees of the government of Guam. Such cost of living index and rate of inflation shall be forwarded annually, on or before May 10 of each year to the Governor, to the Board of Trustees of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, and to the Speaker of the Legislature." Section 57. A new 4 GCA Section 8137.1 is added to read:

#19-19 Section 57

DUCED AL GUYERNMENT BAPENSE

"8137.1. Annual Cost of Living Allowance. Annually, on the first retirement payday after July 1 of each year, each person entitled to receive a benefit under this Chapter shall receive, in addition to any other adjustment to which such person may be entitled under this Chapter, an annual lump sum cost of living allowance paid out of the General Fund and administered by the Retirement Fund, to be computed by multiplying the entitled benefit times the rate of inflation based on the cost of living index computed annually by the Department of Commerce pursuant to Subsection (f) of Section 47060 of the Government Code. The base year used in these computations shall be calendar year 1988. The right to this cost of living allowance shall be deemed not to be a vested right of the members of the Retirement Fund. The money necessary to fund this section shall be automatically appropriated from the General Fund on an annual basis as required, unless later amended."

Section 58. A new 4 GCA 8137(c) is added to read as follows:

"In addition to all other contributions made by the government to
the Retirement Fund pursuant to this chapter, the government shall

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$1,300,000.00) FROM THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING A SIX HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$625.00) LUMP SUM COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCE FOR GOVERNMENT OF GUAM RETIREES OR THEIR SURVIVORS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1990 ONLY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The sum of One Million Three Hundred Thousand (\$1,300,000.00) is appropriated from the General Fund for the purpose of funding a Six Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$625.00) Lump Sum Cost of Living Allowance for Government of Guam Retirees or their Survivors for Fiscal Year 1990 only.
