Dear Mr. Speaker:

Transmitted herewith is Substitute Bill No. 84, which I have signed into law this date as Public Law 20-62.

Renovation of the existing dormitory and construction of an additional dormitory are indeed necessary to provide safe yet secure facilities for Guam's troubled youth. In order to provide improved housing, I have directed the Department of Youth Affairs to plan improvements at the youth facility in Mangilao. Section 2 appropriates funds for design and construction of a new dormitory.

Since design of the new facility is anticipated to take one year I request that Section 2 be amended as follows:

"Section 2. Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000) are appropriated from the fiscal year 1990 revenues of the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs and One Million Two Hundred Nine Thousand Two Hundred Seventy Five Dollars (\$1,209,275) are appropriated from the fiscal year 1991 revenues of the General Fund to the Department of Youth Affairs for the design and construction of a new dormitory and for the upgrading of the existing dormitory, and for collateral equipment to meet the present needs of Guam. The Department of Public Works shall administer the contracts for the design and construction of the new building as well as for the renovation of the existing building."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Legislative Intent. The Legislature finds that the present dormitory facility of the Department of Youth Affairs (the "Department") has become inadequate because of increasing use over the past years. increasing island population and constant changes of Guam's the socio-economic life will continue to bring stress upon Guam's youth and will cause many to filter into the court system and eventually be confined in the Department's dormitory. Section 2. Appropriation. One Million Four Hundred Fifty-Nine Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$1,459,275) are appropriated

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from the General Fund to the Department for the design and construction of a new dormitory and for the upgrading of the existing dormitory, and for collateral equipment to meet the present needs of Guam. The Department of Public Works shall administer the contract for the design and construction of the new building as well as for the renovation of the existing building.

Section 3. The new dormitory shall have separate areas for "status offenders" and "non-status offenders".

TESTIMONY ON BILL 84

Legislative Bill 84 is a noble idea and I respect Senator Gutierrez' concern in wanting to provide a new facility to meet the overcrowding problems of clientele at the Youth Correctional Facility of the Department of Youth Affairs.

However, the cost for construction of a new facility is not known because design work has not been done. The administration will seek funds for construction from the U.S. Congress in the territory's Capital Improvement Project. At this time it is premature to support a fixed figure.

In the same vein, in August 1988, Governor Ada requested appropriations of \$100,000 from the General Fund for the purpose of expanding the existing dormitories and \$171,000 for the design of a new facility. I would like to request that this august body expedite measures to assist the Department of Youth Affairs in this immediate and pressing concern for an added wing or dormitory to the existing ones which is now expected to cost a total of \$300,000.

Furthermore, I would like to accentuate the need for renovating an existing structure for behaviorally and emotionally disturbed minors expressed in Bills No. 1013 and 1015 (identical ones but different sponsorships under the 19th Guam Legislature). The bills identify an appropriation of \$80,000 for the renovation of an existing structure, \$10,000 for equipment and \$250,000 for staffing. The latter figure needs to be adjusted to reflect \$389,044 as per the following analysis.

Since 1984, the number of admissions to the Department of Youth Affairs detention and rehabilitation facilities have been increasing dramatically. The table below outlines these increases.

The current capacity of the detention and rehabilitation facilities is 34 clients, 10 female beds and 24 male beds. With the figures presented above, one can see that on occasions, there have been as many as 40 clients over the stated capacity on a given day.

With the increased population and increased problems brought about by a rapidly changing society, juvenile delinquency will continue to be a major problem on Guam. This, coupled with the pressures citizens are exerting on the courts for more stern punishment of both adults and youth offenders, points to the need for expanded and improved corrections programming on the island.

Another area of concern is possible lawsuits stemming from the overcrowding. As a result of the overcrowding, incidents of violence and sexual abuse in the present facility have increased. Incidents of this nature increase the likelihood that lawsuits will be brought against the government for not providing safe detention facilities.

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW DORMITORY FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS.

The Committee on Ways & Means held a public hearing on February 8, 1989, to gather testimony on Bill 84. Committee Chair Senator Carl T.C. Gutierrez conducted the hearing, being joined by Senators Herminia D. Dierking, Franklin J.A. Quitugua, George M. Bamba, and Martha C. Ruth.

BACKGROUND

There has been a growing number of youths in need of the residential services of the Department of Youth Affairs. In 1988, the total number of youths admitted there was 492, with the capacity of the present facility at 34 clients. The present dormitory facility is inadequate to meet the current needs and what is available is in need of upgrading.

TESTIMONY

Ms. Lucia Topasna, Director of the Department of Youth Affairs, testified regarding Bill 85. She stated that providing a new facility was a 'noble idea', but she cannot support a specific amount of money as needed at the present time since there has been no design work done. She said that a more immediate solution would be to add a wing to the existing facility, estimated to cost about \$300,000. Ms. Topasna also took the opportunity to point out the need for renovating an existing structure to provide residence for behaviorally and emotionally disturbed minors. This project, including equipment and staffing, would cost \$479,044 according to her estimates.

Ms. Topasna stated that, although the capacity of the present facility is 34 youths (24 males and 10 females), the population pressures have meant that "there have been as many as 40 clients over the stated capacity on a given day." This increased need for service is not expected to abate. She also indicated a concern over
