REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY, UTILITIES AND CONSUMER PROTECTION ON BILL NO. 119 (COR):
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000) TO THE PUBLIC UTILITY AGENCY OF GUAM FOR THE INSTALLMENT OF WATER LINE AND FIRE HYDRANTS IN MAINA.

#### PREFACE

The Committee on Energy, Utilities and Consumer Protection with the Committee on Ways and Means conducted a joint public hearing on Wednesday, February 8, 1989 at 2:00 p.m. in the Legislative Session Hall on Bill No. 119(COR): An act to appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to the Public Utility Agency of Guam for the installment of water line and fire hydrants in Maina. Committee Members present at the public hearing were: Senator Don Parkinson, Chairman (CEUCP); Senator Carl Gutierrez, Chairman (CW&M); Senator Nelson; Senator Quitugua; Senator Unpingco; Senator Brooks; Senator Manibusan; Senator Ruth; Senator Aguon; Senator Dierking; Senator Mailloux; Senator Bordallo and Senator Espaldon.

#### **TESTIMONY**

Testifying before the Committees was Mr. Anthony Blaz, Chief Officer, Public Utility Agency of Guam. Mr. Blaz's testimony is labeled Exhibit 'A'. In his testimony Mr. Blaz stated that the MaiMai area is currently being serviced by 2" water lines and residents are frequently suffering from low water pressure. As a result of this, lives and properties are being exposed to constant danger from inadequate water and lack of fire hydrants for fire protection. Therefore, PUAG fully supports Bill No. 119.

During the public hearing Senator Ruth asked Mr. Blaz whether fire hydrants for Maina is included in the Master Plan (Water Bond)? Mr. Blaz answered that 'yes, Bill No. 119 is included in the \$53 million Water Bond.

Mr. F.C. Lizama, Acting Fire Chief, Guam Fire Department submitted a written testimony during the public hearing. This testimony is labeled Exhibit 'B'. Mr. Lizama stated that the Guam Fire Department fully supports and endorses the passage of this particular Bill. The

installation of this water lines and fire hydrants will provide this community as well as surrounding communities with adequate water and adequate fire protection.

Commissioner Portusach, Commissioner of Agana Heights testified orally in support of this Bill. However, his primary concern was the constant occurance of low water pressure in his village.

#### FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Energy, Utilities and Consumer Protection of the 20th Guam Legislature finds that the necessity of the installation of the water line and fire hydrants in the village of Maina is essential. This Bill will provide adequate water and adequate fire protection for the villagers. Therefore, the Committee on Energy, Utilities and Consumer Protection hereby recomends Bill No. 119 be passed by the 20th Guam Legislature.

Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislative Committee on Energy, Utilities, and Consumer Protection. Relating to the above, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage members of this committee to introduce other legislation to fund similar projects throughout the island where water service problems occur. In addition, we must not forget that along with financing water systems improvements, we must make best use of our investment dollars through efficient operations and maintenance (O & M) of new facilities. In order to do so, continuous funding will need to be in place.
