AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR STREETLIGHTS IN YONA, ROAD PROJECTS IN YIGO, BARRIGADA AND TALOFOFO, AND THE OFFICE OF THE WASHINGTON DELEGATE, TO MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS TO VARIOUS APPROPRIATION ACTS AND THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT FOR FISCAL YEARS 1990 AND 1991, AND TO CORRECT THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION LAW.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000) are appropriated from the  
3 fiscal year 1990 revenues of the General Fund to the Guam Power  
4 Authority for installation of streetlights for the As Namu area, Yona.

5 Section 2. Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are appropriated from  
6 the fiscal year 1990 revenues of the General Fund to the Department of  
7 Public Works for the completion of a road project adjacent to Lot No. 7082,  
8 Santa Rosa, Yigo.

9 Section 3. Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) are appropriated from  
10 the fiscal year 1990 revenues of the General Fund to the Office of the  
11 Guam Delegate to the U.S. House of Representatives, Washington, D.C. to be  
12 used as a contingency fund for fiscal year 1990.

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1 Section 4. Forty-Two Thousand Dollars (\$42,000) are appropriated  
2 from the fiscal year 1990 revenues of the General Fund to the Department  
3 of Public Works to widen to thirty (30) feet and pave one thousand eight  
4 hundred (1800) linear feet of Enrique S. San Nicolas Street, Talofoto.

18 Procedure, or may pursue any other remedies available."

A joint public hearing was conducted by the Committee on Ways & Means and the Committee on General Governmental Operations on Friday, May 5, 1989, beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Legislative Session Hall to hear testimony on Bill No. 375. Committee Chairs, Senator Carl T.C. Gutierrez and Senator Ted S. Nelson respectively, were joined by Senators Martha C. Ruth, Franklin J. A. Quitugua, Doris F. Brooks and J. George M. Bamba.

**BACKGROUND**

Bill No. 375 would appropriate \$100,000 from the General Fund to Yona Commissioner's Office for installation of Streetlights.

**TESTIMONY**

Mr. Vicente Bernardo, Commissioner of Yona, appearing at the hearing on behalf of the Municipal Planning Council and the residents of Yona, gave an oral testimony in full support of Bill No. 375.

Mr. John M. Benavente, General Manager, Guam Power Authority, submitted a written testimony (see Exhibit A).

**ANALYSIS**

The appropriation of \$100,000 will be sufficient for the installation of streetlights in the various areas of Yona as listed in the Bill.

## RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Ways & Means and the Committee on General Governmental Operations recommends that Bill No. 375 be passed by the Twentieth Guam Legislature.
